WASHINGTON-House-Senate rent conferees were confident today that Congress will give housing expediter, Frank R. Creedon, funds to administer rent control through Feb. 29, 1948.

The House voted yesterday to liquidate Creedon's office and most government building controls, on July 1.

At almost the same time, the congressional rent conferees agreed on a bill to extend rent control through the first two months of 1948 - and to put Creedon in charge of the program.

Sen. C. Douglas Buck, R., Del., and other conferees predicted confidently that Congress would end up by giving Creedon enough money to do the rent job.
