"We have applications on hand for projects that would require \$300,000,000, and Congress thus far has appropriated \$72,500,-000" Hook explained. "Of necessity, we must pick and choose the most important jobs, and even there we must compromise, because the money must be spread thinly.

More than 200 applications have had to go back to sponsors for correction, he said, because various legal flaws in forms, or because of insufficient engin-
