

ATLANTA, Ga. (UP)-State chool officials report that some 80 per cent of the buses which daily transport 186,825 Georgia children to classes fail to meet standards established by the Na tional Committee on Safety Edu-

The disclosure was underlined when the state counted its third school bus accident within three

One mishap, on the first day of school, sent 10 children and two mothers to the hospital with injuries. In another, a bus plunged off a bridge, injuring five children and the driver. Faulty brakes vere blamed in both cases.

From one county came a protest that a 42-passenger capacity bus was carrying as many as 70 passengers at a time.
