Gov., inter-foreign languages and countries. I am a member of the American Youth Organization and have been practically off from the outside world for the last 12 years. Owing to shortage of paper in this country, almost no newspapers are issued. Rumors and gossip govern among the people. I am a member of the Catholic Youth Organization of my town and we often discuss the way of living in the USA, the future of a democratic Germany, whether the Americans disregard the Germans or not etc. Many questions and problems are raised in our meetings which I cannot in answer. I should therefore be very pleased to receive news from American newspapers in civilization, American Youth Organizations, and the part the Christian religions play in the States and what the Americans think of the future of Germany. I likewise should be grateful to hear from you in detail how you spent the war-time, and what you do in your spare-time and on your holidays. I'll do the same in return if you want and give you full reports of life in this country. I am therefore looking forward to your letter and I hope that we will make friends each other as time goes on.

SEE GERMAN REDS BARRED FROM ANTI-WESTERN BLOC

LONDON (UP) — British experts on Germany believe any attempt of the Communists of western Germany to join the new international Communist drive against the western powers is doomed to failure.

Experts did not exclude the possibility that German Communists might try to join a general European Communist offensive aimed at wrecking the Marshall Plan and engage in economic sabotage actions, particularly in the Ruhr area.

Such attempts, the experts added, would lead, however, to counter-measures and sanctions by the western allies and in the final analysis to the total isolation of the Communists from the people of western Germany.

Any Communist sabotage actions, experts declared, ultimately would affect the German food supply situation and the bulk of the German population, out of a feeling of self-preservation, therefore would react violently against Communist provocations.

Experts gathered from the result of the recent elections in the Saar territory that the German Communists were unable to increase their strength to any extent worth mentioning, even in an area where they were able to pose as the most patriotic German party because of their opposition to the economic union of the Saar with France.

While the Communist Party of western Germany, in the view of the experts, hardly would be able to join the new anti-western Communist bloc as long as Anglo-American occupation continued, the Socialist Unity Party of eastern Germany was likely to stay out for tactical reasons for the time being.

The latter party, the experts said, could not join a purely Communist international organization without dropping its assertion of not being a Communist party, which so far was the very basis of its existence. Moreover, experts added, Polish and Czech Communists still might be hesitant to co-operate with Germans even if they are Communists.

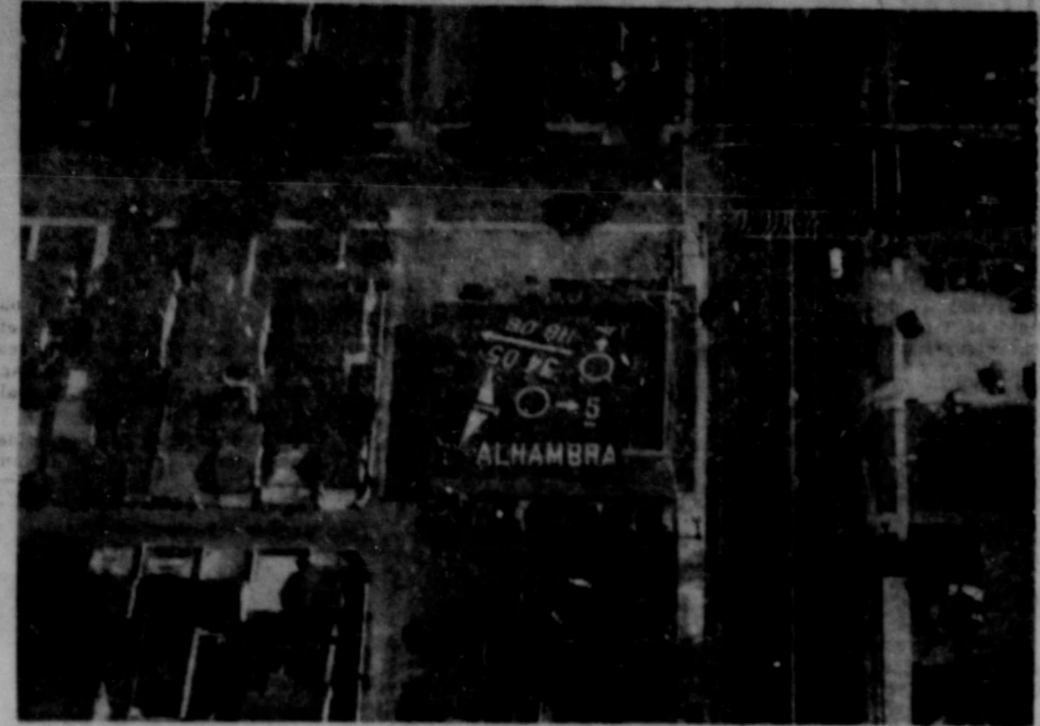

Long Skirts Big Business Plot Against Workers, Britain Is Told

LONDON (UP)—A section of
the British press has aimed its
propaganda guns against the long
skirt program—with the blessing
of the Labor government and
British designers.

Laborite magazines and news-
papers opened up with a barrage
of editorials, articles, and photo-
graphs to prove the originator of
long skirt fashions this season was
a tool in a "lot of big business"
against the working man's wife
and daughter.

The Daily Herald, official voice
of the Labor Party, described the
originator as a "fashion dictator
... responsible neither to God
nor man but only Mammon."
The inflamed editorial writer
exploded: "It is outrageous non-
sense. Longer clothes for all Brit-
ish women should assert them-
selves and refuse to participate
in this madness."
The Labor Herald took its cue
from Sir Stafford Cripps, one of
the cabinet's "big five" who de-
scribed the long skirt as "idiotic."

The British Guild of Creative
Designers, which influences fash-
ions for the ordinary woman rather
than the luxury buyer accep-
ted Cripp's plea to maintain pre-
sent skirt lengths at a saving of

Voodoo Still Scares New Orleans

 NEW ORLEANS (UP)—A New Orleans housewife who found three pieces of cake under her doorstep didn't even look back. She went straight to St. Louis Cemetery No 2 and scratched a sign off the cross on the tomb of Marie Laveau.

It was the only thing to do, she said. Her neighbors and certain policemen agreed.

The cake meant voodoo. The cake was gris-gris, or a manifestation of the kind of hocus-poens brought by slaves from Africa.

Police figured at once that since the housewife was a landlady, one of her tenants was trying to voodoo her because she had filed an eviction notice.

Marie Laveau practiced voodoo in the 1830s. But she was still a power in her tomb today, still able to overcome the power of a bona-fide gris-gris.

St. John the Baptist was still mixed into voodoo activity in New Orleans, though his connection with the mysterious stuff never has been explained. Gris-gris usually was traceable to Negroes, but at least one city detective said white practitioners had been found.

A genuine gris-gris can be almost anything. It can be a hideous monster made from candle grease and match sticks, or pennies in a circle. But whatever form it takes it bodes nothing but ill will for its victim, usually death.

Voodoo does not always deal with death, however. Big handsome, banana-colored Marie Laveau reportedly used it to round up a houseful of husbands.

Along South Rampart street today, a man with a dollar still can buy a box of "stay at home" or "leave me" powder, each of which has voodoo beginnings.

NEW WAY FOUND TO RELIEVE HERNIA IN OLDER PEOPLE

CHICAGO (UP)—Science now has promise of permanent relief for elderly persons suffering from hernia.

Surgery still is necessary, but the repair job is thorough and effective, thanks to the careful experimentation of two Chicago doctors, Raymond W. McNeely and Jacob A. Glassman.

They discovered that in older persons particularly, the abdominal wall tissues near a hernia were worn to a point where repair became difficult.

Doctors for a time tried grafting skin, but the results often left a lot to be desired.

So McNeely and Glassman devised their own method. They employed a laboratory to make for them what are known as vitalium plates, which are stitched to live tissue.

Vitalium, they found, was one repair item which did not fight with the secretions or organs of the body, as do other unsatisfactory metallic substances.

But on Bayou St. John, nobody there takes baths in the blood of a chicken, or mixes rum with wine, Marie did both.

Vitalium is the trade-name given to an alloy whose approximate composition is cobalt 65 per cent, chromium 30 per cent, and molybdenum 5 per cent.

It first was developed as a dental alloy which was resistant to the corrosive action of saliva.






The Chicago physicians explained that the new plates are designed for those hernias which do not offer themselves to the usual methods of repair.

McNeely explained that the repair is used in older persons only because the aged are less active. He doubted if younger persons would be benefited because extreme exertion probably would tear the stitches.

In a large number of cases of such surgery in older persons, he said, the rehabilitation has been complete and no additional surgery was necessary.


