WASHINGTON, D. C. - (NEA) - President's Truman's 10-point anti-inflation program is bogged down in a confusion of 11 different bills, for which Congress has practically no enthusiasm what-

Not even the cabinet officers, left in charge during the President's recent Florida rest, show much enthusiasm for some parts of the program. Some of this lukewarm support may be due to the reluctance of Democratic executives to try to tell a Republican-dominated Congress what kind of laws it should write. But in other particulars, cabinet officials in the execu-

tive departments give the impression that the President's proposals won't all work.

Department of Agriculture officials say that the rationing of meat—number one critical food item in short supply next year—simply cannot be made to work in the United States in peacetime.

Secretary of Labor Schwelienbach says it is preserved to have year controls if price controls. necessary to have wage controls if price controls

Secretary of Commerce Averell Harriman is supposed to be in charge of presenting the President's program to Congress. There is supposed to be the usual clearance by Bureau of the Budget. But nobody is really bossing the job.

TO keep every department from stepping on the toes of every other department that has a particular interest in particular commodities, the work of drafting the bills necessary to show Congress what powers the President wants to carry out his anti-inflation program has been

The Federal Reserve Board is drafting two bills—one is to bring back "Regulation W," which controlled installment buying in wartime, and the other is to limit bank loans.

The Department of Agriculture is drafting four bills—one is intended

to regulate speculative trading on commodity exchanges, while a second would encourage conservation practices in the United States. A third would authorize the Commodity Credit Corporation to operate would permit allocation of grains to essential users.

No legislation is now being prepared to control marketing of live-stock and poultry at weights and grades which represent the most

The Department of Labor has prepared the bill to show Congress how wage controls might be put into effect.

The Department of Commerce has three main responsibilities:

First, it must be ready with a draft of a bill to control prices, when Congress asks for it. Secretary of Agriculture Anderson says price control of meat will be necessary next spring. THE second Commerce job is to be ready with a bill to put con-

The second Commerce job is to be ready with a bill to put consumer rationing in effect on scarce commodities, if the need arises. The President asked for this as a preparedness measure.

Third is the job of getting an extension and enlargement of powers under the Second Decentrol Act, which expires March 31, 1948.

In addition to extending these powers, Commerce now wants authority to control inventories of scarce materials and it wants limited authority to assign priorities on steel, and such other materials which may be found prepared. may be found necessary to allocate, after public hearings. New legislation may be needed for these additional powers.
