Defense Program Might Force Controls on Labor and Wages

VASHINGTON-(NEA)-The need for some of the drastic wartime controls of labor being slapped back on U. S. workers some-

And something like the whole set of emergency labor schemes might be pulled off the shelf. They include such things as drives to get women to go into factory work, drives against absenteeism, incouraging labor to migrate to shortage areas, drives to put the physically handicapped into jobs and the rest. Rosie the Riveter might have to put slacks on again. There might even be attempts to freeze workers in essential jobs on a semi-voluntary basis similar to the way it was done during the war.

A spokesman for the Federal Security Agency puts it this way: "When we started arming for World War II we had a reservoir of shore than 8,000,000 unemployed to fill the sudden demands for workers. The expanded armament program now getting under way will only find about 1,900,000 available."

Already the aircraft manufacturers are finding it tough to get

Already the aircraft manufacturers are finding it tough to get workers for their new contracts. A lot of women can be used on assembly lines. They are easier to recruit. But the plants face a serious shortage of the more skilled workers. All together it is estimated that about 500,000 new workers will be hired in airplane plants. addition to that, close to 20,000 workers will be needed very by the shipbuilding companies. Work is beginning on several ssenger ships. RESIDES ships and planes, this year's fat military budget will cause increased demands for all civilian goods, extra clothing as uniforms for the draftees and others being called into active duty, more than the same was and more equipment generally. This is all added to giant demands for consumer goods that have never even been close

The tightest labor situation this fall exists in the industrial Great

The tightest labor situation this fall exists in the industrial Great Lakes region, in Michigan, Ohio, Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin and Minnesota. Shortages may vary from city to city, but a worker decrif have to travel far to find a job.

According to a recent report by Robert C. Goodwin, director of the U. S. Bureau of Employment Security, out of 138 principal labor market areas in the U. S., only 22 had any surplus of workers. These areas were mostly in the South, a few on the East Coast and in several sections of the West Coast. But his figures are based on studies made during the late summer. In spite of some seasonal unemployment coming up on the farms, the situation has become much tighter.

THE toughest part of trying to encourage workers from surplus areas to migrate to where they can get jobs is the housing shortage.

Whit good is a job if you can't find a place to live?

Goodwin sums up the situation this way: "Manpower is one of the most important factors in the achievement of our national security goals." Today we are faced with continuing high levels of exports and expanding production of national defense materials at a time when we are experienced continuing but there is an 18 months' backlog. Production of transportation equipment has barely made a dent in the reduction of deficits of colling stock and freight cars which have accumulated. 



ORDER OF ELECTION STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF EASTLAND IN COMMISSIONERS COURT

Pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Liquor Control Laws, there is hereby ordered an election to be held in all Election Precincts in the County of Eastland. State of Texas, on the 2nd day of November A. D. 1948 for the purpose of voting on the question of Legalizing the sale of beer that does not contain alcohol in excess of four (4 per cent) per centum by weight.

Said election shall be held on said date at the regular voting places within the above designated areas, and the officers of election heretofore appointed by this Court on the 9th day of February A. D. 1948 and qualified under the laws of this State to hold elections at the respective voting places in said Eastland County, Texas, and they are hereby directed hold this election. It is further rdered that the Clerk of this Court shall post or cause to be posted at least one (1) notice of this order in each voting precinct

The Clerk of this Court shall furnish the presiding officer of each voting box within the above designated area, a number of official ballots not less than twice the number of qualified voters at such voting box-

Said election shall be held in compliance with the General Election laws of Texas, unless otherwise specified.

After the polls are closed the officers of the election shall proceed to count the votes and with in three days thereafter shall make return of the results of said election to the Commissioners Court
