Man Arrested In 22-Year-Old Georgia Murder

HOUSTON, Tex. June 3 (UP) -A murder committed 22 years ago put a 44-year old contractor in Jail today, while police sped from Georgia to try to identify

the accused man.

The suspect, tall and slender, was arrested last night in a rooming house following a telephone request from Sheriff Howard Cagle of Jasper, Ga.

Sheriff Cagle said his department had information that a man named Lindsey Evans, wanted for killing a county policeman in 1927, was living here under an assumed name. The sheriff explained that Evans and four othmen allegedly shot Lee Cate, to search for liquor.

Cate's body was loaded in the auto, the sheriff told Houston police, and was dumped in some woods near Adairsville, in Bartow County, Ga.

Sheriff Cagle said two of the men were convicted and given Thundershowers life terms, and the other two received a sentence of one year in the county jail.

"Lindsey Evans escaped and was never caught, but we have hunted him more than 20 years", the Georgia Sheriff said.

The man held here has denied any knowledge of the crime, and said he came here in 1942 from Tampa, Fla.
