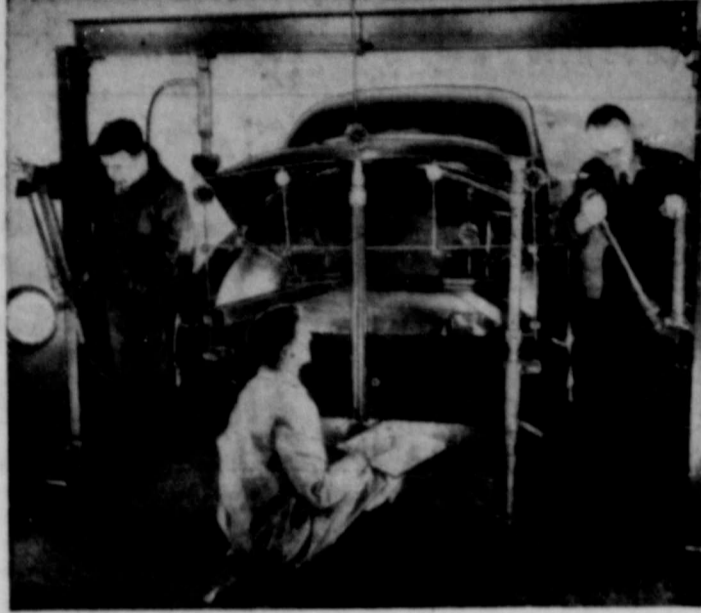

## Temporary Tax For Hospitals Almost Certainty

AUSTIN, Tex., Jan. 16 (UP)—A "temporary tax" to raise money for state mental hospitals is almost certainty today.

Members of the House Revenue and Taxation committee met with Gov. Allan Shivers yesterday to devise a "working plan" to place before lawmakers at a special session of the legislature opening Jan. 31.

Seventeen committee members and house speaker Durwood Mansford conferred with Shivers. The group's spokesman said a majority said they would vote a "temporary tax" to obtain funds for the hospitals.

The tax would expire at the end of the current biennium, Aug. 31, 1951.

Rep. Joe B. Fleming, chairman of the committee, said "no plan was reached," definitely. However some members said a temporary tax plan for about \$25,000,000 or \$26,000,000 would be needed.

Shivers said he had talked to about 50 members of the legislature "trying to get a consensus of opinion on how this problem ought to be solved."

The multi-million dollar program for Texas state hospitals which will be acted upon by the state legislature would set up a second-year operating budget for the hospitals and initiate a long-range building plan.

The U. S. Public Health Service's inspection team which recently surveyed Texas hospitals for mentally ill described the institutions as the worst in the nation.
