WEEKLY BIBLE COMMENT

Antioch—Challenge to Christianity

IT was at Antioch that the disciples of Jesus were first called Christians.

It is necessary to say Antioch in Syria, for this city, about 300 miles north of Jerusalem, was one of 16 Antiochs in the ancient world, and these 16 were among 37 cities, built by Selucus Nikator, a conqueror who lived 300 years before Christ, and who named these cities after himself or his relatives. The Antiochs were named after his father.

Of the 16 Antiochs—Antioch in Pisidia is another mentioned in the New Testament (Acts 13:14)—this Antioch in Syria was much the greatest and finest. It was situated on the River Orontes, navigable from its seaport, 14 miles away. The city in its splendor was called the "Queen of the East," and its seaport at Selucus was strongly fortified, like an ancient Gibraltar.

The modern Antioch a writer has described as "a small, ignoble, and dirty town of 6000 inhabitants," but the ancient Antioch, a city of half a million inhabitants was of an outward grandeur and magnificence that almost baffles the imagination.

A DOUBLE-COLONNADED street ran for five miles through the city, from east to west, on which its inhabitants in rainy weather could walk under cover, and in conformity with this immensity were its public works and buildings, its pagan temples, its treasures of art, its trees, gardens, fountains and all the tokens of outward culture from every part of the world.

Nor was it only the beginning of a great name. Here, also, in Antioch was the beginning of the Christian missionary enterprise that started Christianity on its western way, fulfilling the commission to preach the gospel to the ends of the earth. It was a great beginning, and the end is still far off, as Jesus still leads on.

Weekly Wool Review

Southwest wool trade was highlighted the past week by sales of 12-month wools and contracting of 8-month wools in the Texas hill country.

Mohair trading was dull in both Texas and at Boston, the USDA's production and marketing administration reported.

Prices of \$1.60 to \$1.65 a pound, clean cost, delivered to Boston, were paid for occasional lots of 12-month wool sold in Tex-

as. About 60,000 fleeces of 8-months wool were contracted in the Del Rio section of Texas at 61 to 62 cents per pound, grease basis. F. O. B. these contracts were one to two cents above those for similar wools in the same section a year ago.

Mainly due to lack of stocks, Texas wools found only limited trading in the Boston market, the federal agency noted.

Activity was slow in the territory states. A seal bid sale in Roswell, N. M., last week saw two clips sold at an estimated clean cost of around \$1.65, delivered to Boston.

TAMPICO, Mexico, Feb. 4 (UP)—This eastern coastal town woke up early today to welcome the Duke and Duchess of Windsor, arriving to spend two weeks on a nearby ranch which night have been designed for royalty.

Their host will be Clint Murchison, Dallas Tex., oilman whose 15,000-acre property is considered one of the showplaces of this area.

He said it was his first visit to Mexico in 30 years. The train left Nuevo Laredo at 6 P. M. for Monterrey where another welcoming committee awaited the famous couple.

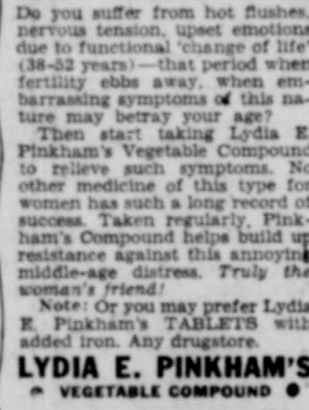

SPY CASE MAY SCUTTLE BOMB DATA EXCHANGE

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4 (UP)—The arrest of British scientist Dr. K. E. J. Fuchs on spy charges appeared today to have scuttled current Anglo-American talks on the exchange of a bomb data.

Senate leaders who discussed the spy case with FBI and atomic officials said they "wouldn't give a dime" for the chances that the United States would pool its atomic information with her two wartime partners, Great Britain and Canada.

Chairman Brien McMahon, D. Conn., of the joint congressional atomic energy committee conceded in a radio broadcast over the Columbia Broadcasting system last night that Fuchs' arrest "will prejudice the successful conclusion" of the tripartite discussions.

He said he was certain, however, that the British are "just as unhappy about this unfortunate incident as we are."

The parleys, which are now in their final stages here, are designed to increase the flow of atomic information between the

three countries. President Truman has assured congress he would consult it before negotiating any agreement.

"Sen. Tom Connally, D., Tex., a member of the atomic committee agreed with McMahon that the Fuchs arrest has turned congress against such an agreement. He said the incident would cause this country "to tighten up on our security regulations both here and abroad."

During the war, Britain and Canadian scientists shared data freely in the development of the A-bomb. But since then congress has imposed strict limits on what information may be exchanged.

Britain and Canada now want to be restored to full time partnership in the allied atomic project.

It was reported that before the Fuchs arrest, the negotiators in the current parleys were about ready to agree upon a three-nation pool in which the United States would share its atomic data in return for a British agreement not to manufacture A-bombs on their own.

Detecting Goes Away At Guthrie

GUTHRIE, Okla., Feb. 4 (UP)—A bullet-punctured auto and a wounded stranger in town don't necessarily add up to criminal doings, the Guthrie Police Department found out today.

Officers discovered a parked car with three bullet holes in it, then learned a soldier had checked in at a hotel, one of his hands bandaged.

The car turned out to belong to a Texas man who explained that the Snyder, Tex., police chief fired at him 10 days ago.

"He was shooting at somebody else. It was all a mistake," the Texan said.

The soldier, a Kansan, said he'd never seen the car before and didn't know the Texan.

"My hand?" he said. "Oh, I broke a finger the other day."

Learns About Lightning Striking

OKLAHOMA CITY, Feb. 4 (UP)—George L. Baker, Abilene College student, can speak

on the old "lightning never strikes twice" theory.

The 25-year-old student was en route to a hospital here yesterday for treatment of a knee injury when a train struck his automobile.

Baker was thrown from the car, but received only one injury.

It was a cut on the knee—the already-injured knee.
