week ago in the Pacific. Twenty six of the crew were picked up from five life rafts after drifting helplessly under the scorching sun of the vast Pacific were found aboard the Elder a few hours later. All were reported in good condition.

The survivors reported Elder was swept by a sudden engineroom fire at midnight March 10 while steaming to Eniwetok Atoll to take part in the spring at-
