TOKYO, Wednesday, August 8 (UP)-An American offensive that has driven 11 miles along the Korean south coast in two days removed any immediate threat to the port of Pusan today. But a perilous situation developed to the north where the Communists breached the Naktong river defense line and began pouring troops through. Teague. South Korean emergency capital, was in danger.
