UN Fights Off Banzia Attack On Waterfornt

TOKYO, Wednesday, Dec. 20 (UP)-U.S. 3rd Division troops in the Hungnam beachhead backed into a two by five mile escape pocket along the waterfront Tues-day as the revitalized North Korean army announced it would invade South Korea again with the help of the Chinese Reds.

In their fighting withdrawal, the 3rd Division doughboys abandoned Yonpo airport four miles southwest of Hungnam, leaving only "burglar alarm" outposts ringing the city to warn of new Red at-

Fighting with their backs to the sea along the vital waterfront escape docks, the rear guards beat "Banzai" attacks in which the revived North Korean army joined the Chinese Communists for the

A vast Allied armada in Hungnam Harbor helped beat back the Red attacks with a flashing curtain of fire. The armada included three deadly rocket launcher ships very close in to shore as well as the battleship Missouri, six aircraft carriers, two cruisers and many destroyers and minesweep-

The South Korean government announced that Seoul would be defended and began drafting thousands of men between the ages of 27 and 40 for the fight.






