COCA, Fla., April 21 (UP)—A beautiful young Public Health Nurse told a coroner's jury here late last night, that her employer, Dr. Hans Strasser, brooded about his wife's infidelity before shooting her to death as she lay in bed nude beside the nurse's husband.

Dr. Strasser, Brevard County Health Officer, is being held in the County Jail on a charge of murdering his attractive brunette wife.

No verdict was announced after the corner's jury heard testimony from Mrs. James R. Howie who worked as a nurse for Strasser. She told the jury about the shooting which took place early April 14 after an all-night drinking party in the Strasser home at Cocoa Beach.
