Youthful Track Coach Believes He Has Wonderful Track Team

WASHINGTON, May 3 (UP)—Track Coach Frank Sevine of Georgetown University has done his job too well.

Frank, at 28 the youngest mentor of a major track squad, has been forced to break up his two-mile relay team and run the boys in individual competition. The quartet that broke the world's two-mile relay mark seven times

just couldn't find adequate challengers. The team made up of Dave Boland, Grand Rapids, Mich., who runs the lead-off, Running second is Joe Lapiere, Boston, who also can step a fast mile. Going third is Carl Joyce, also of Boston. The anchor man is Joe Deady, Plainfield, N. J.

The best two-mile relay time for the four is 7:35.8, a new world mark. Compare that with two-mile combine Georgetown shocked the track world with in 1925. Those boys hit off a 7:41.3 global mark.

None of the present team has any idea of making a career in professional athletics. Very few pro track stars make enough to eat well.

All of these boys are looking to a career in business. Boland, Joyce and Deady are aiming for a degree in Bachelor of Social Science. Lapiere is training for a career in Social Science.

The dandy of the outfit is Deady. I watched him step off a

1:02.1 half mile in the District of Columbia A.A.U. meet on the Georgetown track. That equals the best time for a half-mile get-around done outdoors this season. Previously, the same record was set by John Barnes of Occidental College, Los Angeles. Deady, a senior, has turned in a mile of 4:16.9, which isn't bad for a country runner. He'd like to go into business.

but he has a call to answer—from Uncle Sam. Joe has received word that he's up for induction soon, but hopes to get time to compete in the California Relays in Los Angeles May 18. Coach Sevine hopes to patch his four stars back into a relay team for the last time for that meet. Deady plans to run the anchor leg against Barnes. Sevine got his training at Seton Hall in New York, where he was a middle distance runner. He claims to have been "not much of a sensation," but after he returned from a hitch in the Navy he went back as a Seton Hall Prep Coach and recognized talent in two of the boys he has on hand now—Joyce and Lapiere. He coaxed them into coming to Georgetown when he took on as track coach here.

"I have worked hard here," he said, "But the boys have worked harder. They are a great bunch and would bust a vessel to win for me. I'm not as proud of them as a runner as I am of them as great Americans. They possess the competitive spirit which makes for leading citizens. If they make that goal, and all of them will, then I can take a small bow."

**O'Dwyer Denies All Charges**

WASHINGTON, May 3 (UP)—Senate Crime Investigators, their explosive report branded "fantastic" and "exaggerated" by Ambassador William O'Dwyer, coldly started whipping legislative proposals into shape today.

Other shocked targets of the report were beginning to hit back, but committee members moved into the next phase of their investigation—translation of their findings into actual legislation in "a couple of weeks."

In addition to O'Dwyer, Gov. Fuller Warren of Florida also scored the report. He charged that former committee chairman Estes Kefauver, D., Tenn., "smeared" him in the report as part of a "political deal" with Warren's enemies to get support for the 1952 Democratic presidential nomination. Kefauver called that "ridiculously and absolutely untrue."

**Final Argument Set for Today**

AUSTIN, May 3 (UP)—Final approval was expected in the House of Representatives today on the controversial bill lifting truck load limits in Texas from 48,000 to 58,420 pounds.

The lower chamber approved the measure on second reading late yesterday giving it a spot high on today House's calendar.

The House-approved bill to collect an estimated \$30,000,000 annual tax on the gathering of natural gas was headed for upper chamber action following committee approval yesterday.

The truck load limit measure, written by Sen. John Bell of Cuero and sponsored in the House by Rep. Joe Kilgore, of McAllen, received a 75-to-54 approval after two amendments were tacked on in the lower house.

**That Old Louis Dynamite Punch May Be Gone From Fistdom Forever**

DETROIT, May 2 (UP)—Brown Bomber Joe Lewis threw nothing but duds at Omelie Agramonte, but the mogul of boxing were busy lining him up today for an even tougher fight against Lee Savold in New York June 13.

Louis took a unanimous 10-round decision from Agramonte last night at Olympia Stadium, the second time he's done that in recent months.

But it wasn't the old Louis—that "trademarked" dynamite punch was gone, perhaps forever. The one-time bomber said he was out

for a knockout, tried his 36-year-old best to score it, and failed. When the bell for the end of the fight rang, Agramonte still was on his feet and fighting.

Joe scored a nine-count knockout in the second round. But the Cuban was "resting" most of that time and wasn't in any real danger. So today President Jim Norris of the International Boxing Club

... he was getting ready a match Louis against British Empire Heavyweight champion Savold at the Polo Grounds. And the winner of that will probably get a shot at champion Erzsard Charles—the goal Louis has been seeking in his glory-less comeback. "I figure I can take Savold," said Joe, "and really be ready for Charles then."

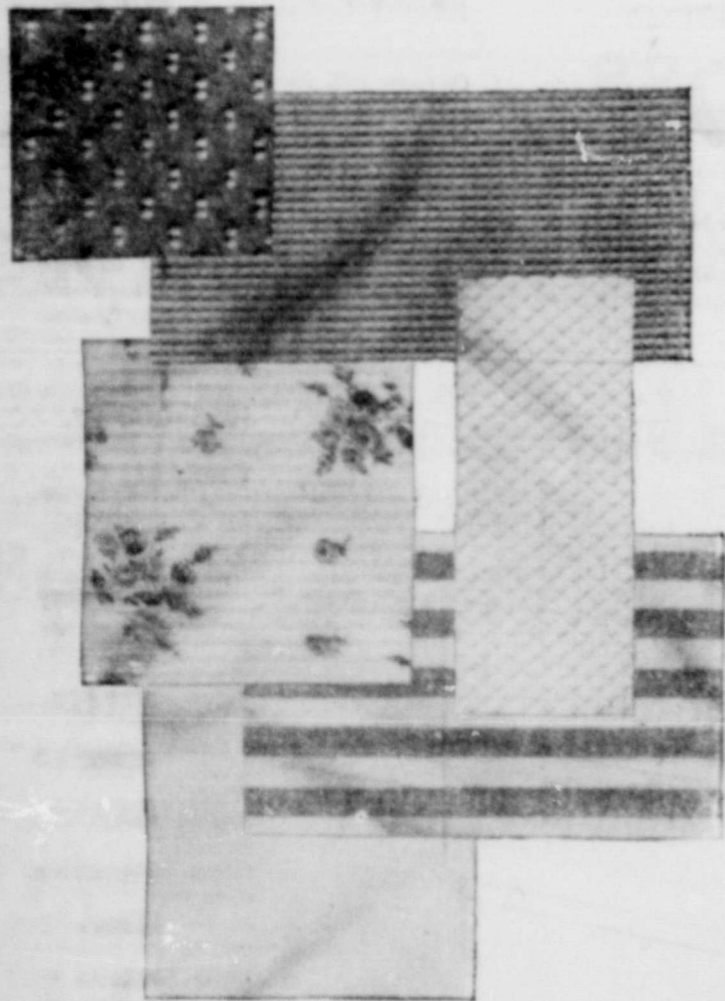

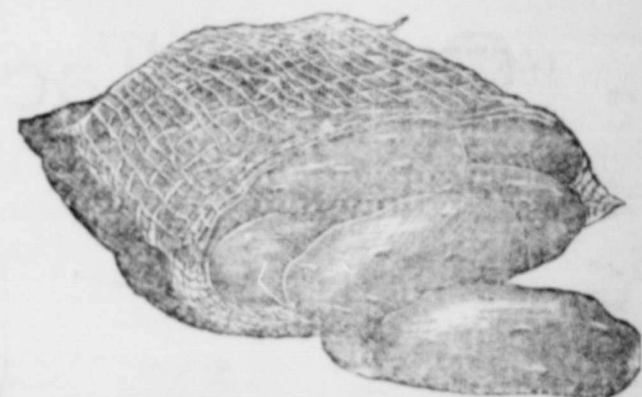

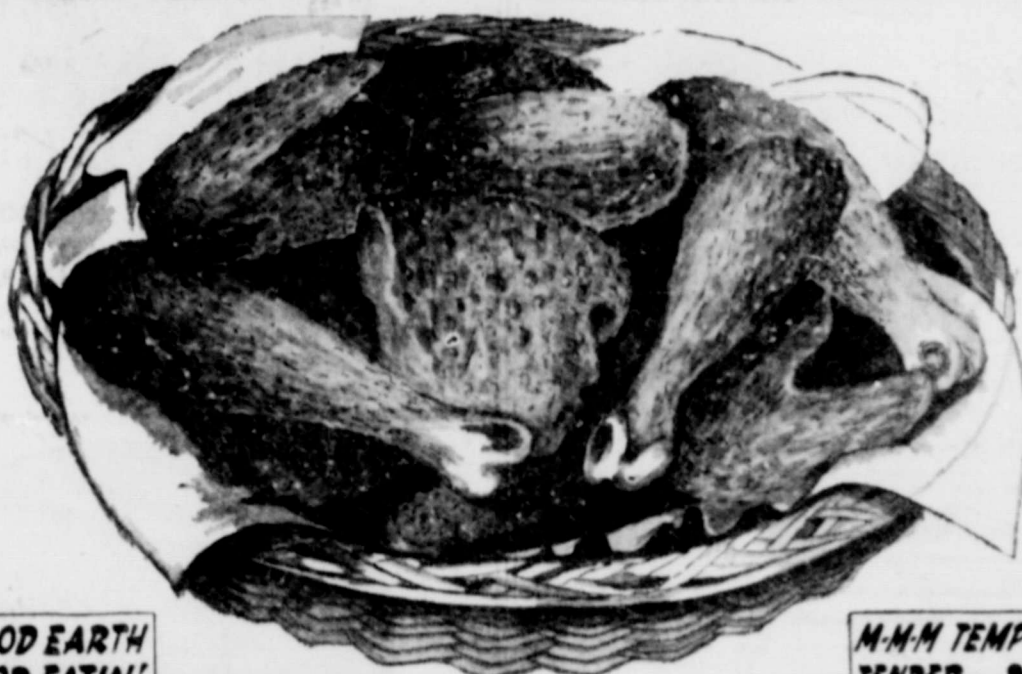

**New Motor Can Save US Gas**

TULSA, OKLA., May 3 (UP)—General Motors showed the oil industry today a new high compression engine which could cut gasoline bills 30 per cent if high octane were available.

The "19XX" motor, a compact V-8 test model with 12-to-1 compression ratio, was introduced by GM's research laboratories at a meeting here of the American Petroleum Institute's Division of Refining.

Charles L. McCuen, GM vice president and research director, said higher octane levels and better design could save U.S. mo-

torists \$2,500,000,000 (B) a year in fuel bills.

This amount, to 10,500,000,000 gallons of gas a year, McCuen said, enough to match annual fuel consumption of about 15,000,000 (M) cars, trucks and buses.

GM's "19XX" engine, mounted on a 1951 Cadillac sedan chassis equipped with an improved Hydramatic automatic transmission and burning high octane gas not commercially available, registered 29 miles a gallon at 30 miles an hour.

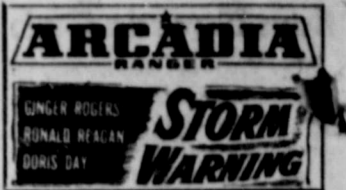

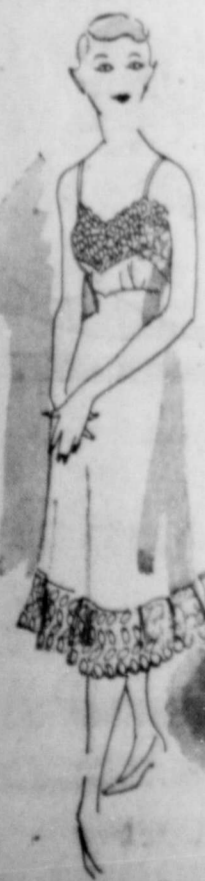

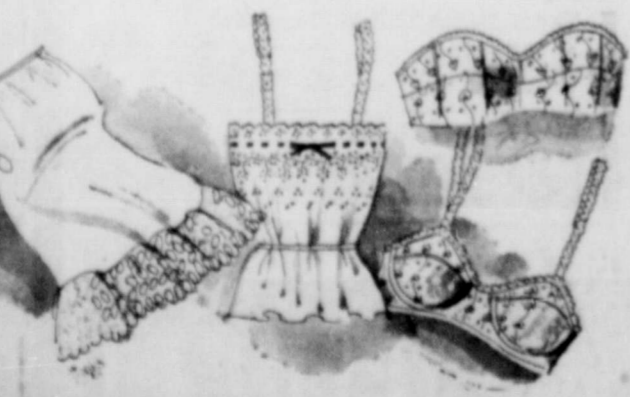
