## Italian Voters Throw Out Communists

### REJECTED TAX BILL

It is difficult to reconcile the House rejection of the compromise tax bill with the concept of serving the best interests of the state and its people. It looks as if the House was pressurized or mesmerized by a group whose zeal for special aims outweighed its concern for the general good.

That group seeks to put on a big rural road building program, all out of porportion to the development of state highways, and to saddle the burden of the expense largely upon one industry.

Gov. Shivers charged Tuesday, and he doubtless had ample grounds for the assertion, that county judges and commissioners are behind this movement, seeking to gain control of rural road building and the funds therefore, so that, as the governor expressed it, we would have 254 different road building programs. Surely this movement does not represent the wishes of the people of Texas, or any substantial fraction thereof. We believe the governor was eminently correct when he said:

· I don't think the people of Texas want the county commissioners to build their roads in preference to the High-

way Department. . Nor do we believe the people sanction the attempt to sock that one industry - natural gas-for the cost of the rural road scheme, with a 200 per cent tax increase. For one thing, it is inequitable, and the vast majority of the American people believe in fair play. For another, the tax would be passed on to the consumers, added to their gas

Those who want to mulct natural gas for the cost of this abnormal rural road activity because there is no considerable natural gas business in their rural districts take a short-sighted view. The industrial centers of the state contribute a large share of the cost of schools, highways and other state services throughout the state. Indeed, but for the gas industry, the oil, sulphur and other major industries, the state would not be enjoying the general prosperity it does, and the rural sections would be improverished.

. The compromise tax bill, rejected by the House, fell short of the equality and uniformity prescribed by the Constitution. It imposed a 10 per cent tax on natural gasa higher rate than any other industry pays-and it overlooked some untaxed industries. But it was about as equitable a bill as could be hoped for. By turning it down the House has marred an otherwise fairly good legislative record for the session. It should either reconsider its action or adopt a substantially similar measure.

ROME, Italy, May 29 (UP)—Italian voters have thrown Sponsors of a compromise draft out Communist or left-wing Socialist governments in six provincial capitals, the interior ministry announced today, and early returns indicated similar results in the big cities of Genoa and Venice.

The Ministry reported that candidates of the Christian Democrats and other Anti-Communist parties won in 13 of the 27 capitals involved in the two-day election that ended

Six of the 13 for which complete official returns were available were wrested from the Communists or left-wing Socialists while Anti-Communists retained the other seven from previous elections.

The Anti-Communists also threatened to gain control in Bologna, the largest city in northern Italy's "Red" belt. The issue there was in doubt as the Communist bloc clung to a tiny lead over Anti-Communist candidates, with 95

Candidates of Premier Alcide De Gasperi's Pro-Western Christian Democratic Party wrested control from the Reds in Venice and Genoa

They also won in Milan, now governed by a right-wing Socialist but with a split left-right administration which made effective work impossible.




