

### COMMIES REFUSE TO ADMIT **AMERICAN NEWSMEN TODAY**

UN ADVANCE BASE BELOW KAESONG, Korea, July 12 (UP)—The United Nations broke off Korean cease-fire talks abruptly today when the Communists refused to admit the free press to the conference city of Kaesong.

The halt came after nine hours of talking in meetings Tuesday and Wednesday had brought "an armistice much nearer," in the words of one UN official. Late this afternoon, the three Admirals and two Gener-

als of the UN Armistice Team still were in this advance base. They will not go to Kaesong for the third cease-fire meeting, scheduled to have started at 10 a.m. Thursday (8 p.m. Wednesday EDT), until the Communists let selected press representatives enter Kaesong.
