TROOPS SLUG FORWARD II **BIG TWO-DAY OFFENSIVE**

United Nations Troops drove hard into Communist defenses all along the Korean front today to keep up pressure on the more than 400,000 Communist troops looming as an ominous threat behind the stalled cease-fire talks. On the Central Front, troops who slugged forward four miles toward Kumsong, the Big Red Communications and

supply base, rested briefly after their two-day offensive

while Allied Warplanes ripped up the Communist lines. The 8th Army said there were now from 200,000 to 250,-000 Communist Troops opposed to UN forces on the West-Central Front. Earlier front reports said that at least 400,-000 Reds were massed in a build-up area behind the Communist front line troops and front commanders warned of a Communist "doublecross" if cease-fire negotiations went

There were reports that the Reds were digging in around Kaesong, the Cease-Fire conference site. UN patrols in that zone have bumped into Red units on every probing mission and the Reds were believed using the conference immunity provisions to strengthen defense of their only remaining holding in South Korea.

The 8th Army also said that enemy material captured last week was "markedly less" than in previous weeks, indicating that the Reds were becoming unusually careful in preserving their stores even while withdrawing.

Action late yesterday was described as "relatively quiet." That included a bitter seven-hour battle northeast of Hwaon, below Kumsong to the East, and a six-hour scrap few miles farther North. Red Forces broke off the fight by withdrawing before the stubbornly advancing Allies.







Need A New Home?

The purpose of the Low-Rent House Project is to provide decent, safe, and sanitary housing for families of low income whose inadequate earnings do not make it possible for them to obtain suitable housing elsewhere. Tenants must constitute a family unit such as husband and wife; mother and small children; or other type of family unit.

A family is eligible if the family income is very low. Maximum net family income for two adults is \$2,000; with one minor child \$2,350; with two minor children \$2,450; with three minor children \$2,800; with four minor children \$2,900; with five minor children \$3,000; and with six

Further eligibility requirements are that the head of the family is a citizen of the United States, and that the family is either now renting sub-standard housing or is entirely without housing in Ranger, or that the family head is a veteran.

Housing is substandard if it has a leaky roof, drafty floors, or is in a general run-down condition. Also if the present house lacks a toilet or bath or running water, or if it can not be properly heated, or ventilated, or if it is extremely overcrowded.

Rents are based on the family income and number of minor dependents. The family income includes income from all sources received by all members of the family; wages, salaries, commissions, bonuses, tips, pensions, allot ments and similar types of receipts. The following scale shows the approximate rents and in come limits for addmission for families with less than three minor dependents.


