



Slick Maneuvers Take Teeth Out of Model 'Wetback' Bill

Giving a highly-involved legal opinion impromptu, Gore ruled it out.

INCIDENTALLY, it was noted that former Congressman Stephen Pace, now lobbyist for the Cotton Council, was on the floor of the House while this maneuver was put over. And as the bill passed, 250 to 139, the old rebel yell of Civil War days arose from the Democratic
