RED DELEGATES EXPECTED TO STAGE WALKOUT TOMORROW

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 7 (UP) — A plot to kill Andrei Gromyko and other members of his delegation through a planned traffic accident on the Bayshore Freeway was revealed early today.

San Francisco and Peninsula law enforcement agencies quickly maneuvered themselves into a large convoy of heavily armed officers. Their mission was to watch for and stop a beer truck which was supposed to be smashed at

high speed into the car bringing the Russian delegation to the Japanese peace conference this morning.

San Francisco officers heard of the plot from Sgt. Otto Schramm of the Redwood City office of the California Highway Patrol. Schramm phoned Inspector Michael Crystal shortly after midnight to tell him he had received a call from an FBI agent, who identified himself as H. W. Baker. Schramm said Baker teld him the FBI had just received Schramm said Baker told him the FBI had just received

a tip from an informer that White Russians in San Francisco were plannnig to kill Gromyko and his associates. The informer told the FBI that the White Russians knew when the Soviet delegation left its Hillsborough Mansion for San Francisco and what route they used. Their plan was to ram the official limousine with the beer truck.




