Lesson-Sermon "Sacrament"

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE SERVICE

The importance of gaining right desire will be discussed in the Lesson-Sermon titled "Sacrament" to be read in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, Jan. 13.

The Golden Text is from Psalms (24:3,4): "Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? or who shall stand in his holy place? He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart."

The spiritual meaning of the sacrament is pointed out in this citation from the Bible: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ?" (1 Corinthians 10:16).

From the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, will be read this correlative citation: "The true sense is spiritually lost, if the sacrament is confined to the use of bread and wine. The disciples had eaten, yet Jesus prayed and gave them bread. This would have been foolish in a literal sense; but in its spiritual significance, it was natural and beautiful" (page 32).

West German's Approve Coal Resource Pool

BONN, Germany, Jan. 12 (UP)—The West German Bundestag, the lower house of parliament, ratified the Schuman Plan to pool Western Europe's coal and steel resources today by a vote of 232 to 143. Three members abstained.

Chancellor Konrad Adenauer announced during his final speech on the ratification that he intends visiting Washington this spring. In his attempt to align West Germany fully with the Allies, he already has visited Paris, London and Rome.

Adenauer warned parliament in urging approval of the historic Schuman Plan, that Western Europe still faces the threat of Soviet aggression.

Ratification came on the parliamentary "third reading" of the bill for approval.

Beaumont Records First 1952 Death From Polio

BEAUMONT, Jan. 12 (UP)—Beaumont today counted its first victim of polio in 1952. Twelve-year-old Mary Joyce McDonald died of bulbar type infantile paralysis here yesterday.
