Iranian Premier Confers With UM. **British Leaders**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30 (UP)-President Trusan and Prime Minster Winston Churchill of Britain personally appealed to Iranian Prime Minister Mohammed Mossadegh Saturday to accept a new formula providing "an early and equitable solution" to the Angloranian oil dispute.

"We are attaching proposals for action which our two governments are prepared to take and which we incerely hope will meet with your approval and result in a satisfacto-

ry solution," the message said. The two statesmen told Mossadegh that if he agreed to let the nternational court rule on compensation for the seized British oil in-dustry in Iran and resume negotiaions on resumption of oil produc-

1. The United States would imediately grant Iran \$10 million to eet its critical budget problem.

2. Britain would lift its boycots exports to Iran and Iranian use

3. Officials of the British Anglo-Iranian Oil Co. would make arrangements for movement of oil already stored in Iran and appropriate payments made as soon as agreements on price and physical conditions of loading permit


