**New Orleans Cops Hunt Jewel Thief**

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 6 (UP)—Police searched Saturday for the knife-wielding "trained thief" who snatched two valuable diamond rings from the owner of famous Arnaud's restaurant early Friday.

Leon R. Bellis, an official of the New Orleans diamond exchange, said one ring bore a 51-carat stone believed to be "about the sixth largest cut diamond in America."

Mrs. Germaine Cazenave Wells, owner of the French Quarter restaurant and daughter of its founder, the late Count Bertrand Arnaud Cazenave, said the rings were taken from her at knife point.

Bellis said the big stone was one he had measured and knew well.

He said it came from a royal collection in Europe. The other ring was said to have been set with a cluster of diamonds worth \$16,000.
