Hollywood Songwriters Trying To Write Appropriate Song For Army

By Aline Mosby HOLLYWOOD, Sept. 11 (UP)—Hollywood songwriters are trying to write a song for the Army. They're leaving their pencils over new tunes Thursday, but they're leaving out the "Moons and Junes." They're trying to write a theme song for the Army. This deplorable situation should be remedied, according to Col. Daniel Imboden of the Army public relations office here, because the Army theme song has been strictly departmental. "We want a tune that will represent the entire Army," he said. "So we've asked several Hollywood songwriters like Jimmy McHugh to offer their ideas. "In the Air Force you can go sailing 'Into the Wild Blue Yonder', but we just have that artillery song and some song about the infantry. I can't even remember the name of that." Songwriter Wilbur Hatch, musical director for CBS radio, said he's "trying like crazy" to come up with the winning number. "I haven't even written an acceptable one myself yet," he admitted. "I've torn up 15 tries. I just haven't hit it yet." GIs Will Test Them "The song, I think should have an easily recognizable tune, and some beginning phrase of just a few notes so it can be whistled." The Army plans to take its time about selecting the winner. The contributions will be weighed out by heads of the top recording and music publishing companies. The songs that survive will be played by Army bands at camps and bases around the world. Then the tune that sides to popularity with the GIs will go down in history as the Army theme song.
