

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTED FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE HEALTH, SANITATION AND SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC, PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE, TRASH AND RUBBISH WITHIN THE CITY OF RANGER, DEFINING THE VARIOUS KINDS OF GARBAGE, REGULATING THE KINDS AND SIZE OF RECEPTACLES IN WHICH TO PLACE SAME, THE MANNER OF ITS PREPARATION AND WHERE IT MUST BE PLACED TO BE COLLECTED BY THE CITY OF RANGER...

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF RANGER:

Section 1. The accumulation of waste, refuse, trash and other deleterious substance on the premises of private residences, commercial institutions and in streets and alleys constitutes a public menace and nuisance and greatly increases the danger of the spread of infectious, contagious and epidemic diseases...

Section 2. The term "garbage" as used in this ordinance shall be held to mean all animal or vegetable matter, such as waste material and refuse from kitchens, residences, grocery stores, butcher shops, restaurants, cafes, hotels, rooming houses, and other deleterious substances.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation owning, managing, operating, leasing or renting any premises, or any place where kitchen garbage accumulates, to provide a portable garbage can constructed of galvanized iron, tin or other suitable metal...

Section 4. The places of wholesale accumulations, such as killing and dressing plants for fowl, wholesale fruit and vegetable houses, storage and other places where the daily accumulation of kitchen garbage, trash and rubbish is more than the ordinary quantities, are not included in the service furnished by the City Garbage Department...

Section 5. Heavy dead animals, such as cows, horses and mules shall be delivered to the city dump ground at the expense of the owner or person having same in charge in the manner directed by the designated official.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (UP)—The Justice Department scheduled a new hearing Saturday in an effort to determine whether the famous little tramp of the silent movies should be given his most important "bum's rush."

Granery ordered the Immigration Service to bar the famed comedian from re-entering the United States until a hearing has been held to decide if he is admissible under U. S. laws.

Chaplin, a British subject, who has lived in this country for some 40 years without applying for naturalization, sailed for his native England last Wednesday with his wife and four children. His wife is Oona O'Neill, daughter of the American playwright Eugene O'Neill.

KANSAS CITY VOTE FRAUD UNDER NEW HOUSE PROBE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (UP)—House investigators were hot Saturday on a new lead on an old mystery—the Kansas City vote fraud case.

The House subcommittee investigating the Justice Department announced that Attorney General James P. McGranery has granted it permission to inspect documents allegedly "stripped" from FBI files on the case.

The lead was furnished Friday by Rep. Claude I. Baskwell, R-Mo., who quoted FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover as saying former Attorney General Tom C. Clark ordered a lot of material "deleted" from the FBI files on the case five years ago.

According to Baskwell, Hoover didn't get any of the material back until two years later when Clark was elevated to the Supreme Court.

The House subcommittee promptly requested and received permission from McGranery to inspect the "deleted" material.

Chairman Frank L. Chelf, D-Ky, and Rep. Kenneth R. Keating, R-N.Y., ranking minority member of the subcommittee, announced their group would begin inspecting the "missing" documents Monday.

They called the revelation of the existence of the documents "startling" and said "this sudden new development may change our plans considerably."

Baskwell has been inspecting the Justice Department's records for the past week in an attempt to get to the bottom of the six-year-old mystery. Chelf and Keating said, however, that the "extracted"

documents and certain interoffice memoranda are not included in the "official files" of the case.

The case stems from charges that fraud was committed in the 1946 Democratic primary in which Enos Axtell, supported by President Truman, defeated Rep. Roger C. Slaughter.

The Justice Department ordered only a preliminary investigation in Kansas City until someone blew up the Jackson county courthouse safe and stole the disputed ballots. It then ordered a full-scale inquiry. Republican congressmen have complained that the FBI should have been cut loose before all the evidence was gone.
