Dr. T. C. Longnecker, Texas Research Foundation grass man, was consultant to 500 golf cour-ses in Commecticut, Long Island, New Jersey, and Metropolitan New York, as well as a staff member of Rutgers University before coming to Texas.

Here are his pointers for homeowners anywhere in the U. S. for growing a good lawn:

Watering- Water your lawn once every one to two weeks, as rainfall indicates, to a depth of five to six inches. Give it a good seaking. Light daily watering does more harm than good. It lets weed on the ground germinate and makes a shallow root system in the grass.

Mowing-Cut the grass high enough not to damage it. Dr. Longnecker recommends grass be cut to not less than 1 and one-

fourth inches high. Fertilizer-Use during the fall or spring when no weeds are growing. Fertilizer use in the summer may help the weeds more than the grass. Apply fertilizer when the grass blades are very dry-no dew or rain still on them-or you may burn the grass. You don't have to water the grass right after applying fertilizer, but it helps.






