City Hall Nears Completion

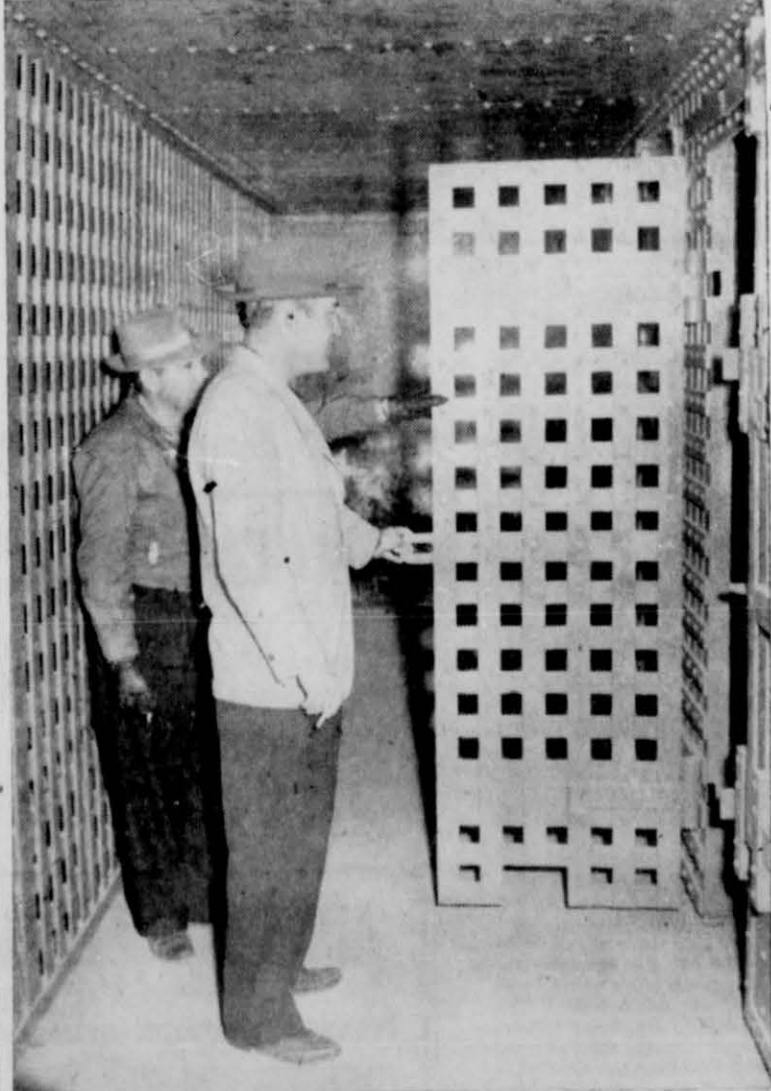
The new \$85,000 Dimmitt City Hall is nearing completion and should be ready for use by January 1 if present work plans are carried out.

No plans for an open house or public showing of the building have been announced.

Workmen were busy plastering, painting, wiring and cleaning as the building began to take final shape. The jail room and fire station section is virtually completed and the roofers are winding up their work.

The jail sits in the middle of a large room on the East wing of the building, and although it is many years old (purchased second hand from near Fort Worth) it is a marvel of absolute human containment. Most observers agree that the only way anyone could get out of that jail is with a cutting torch and plenty of time.

Construction of the new City Hall is by Southwestern Bricklaying Company of Amarillo.

The modern new City Hall will have offices for the city manager and his staff, fire chief living quarters, room for a police department and jail, stalls for three fire trucks, a vault, accounting and city service office and a council room for the city commissioner.

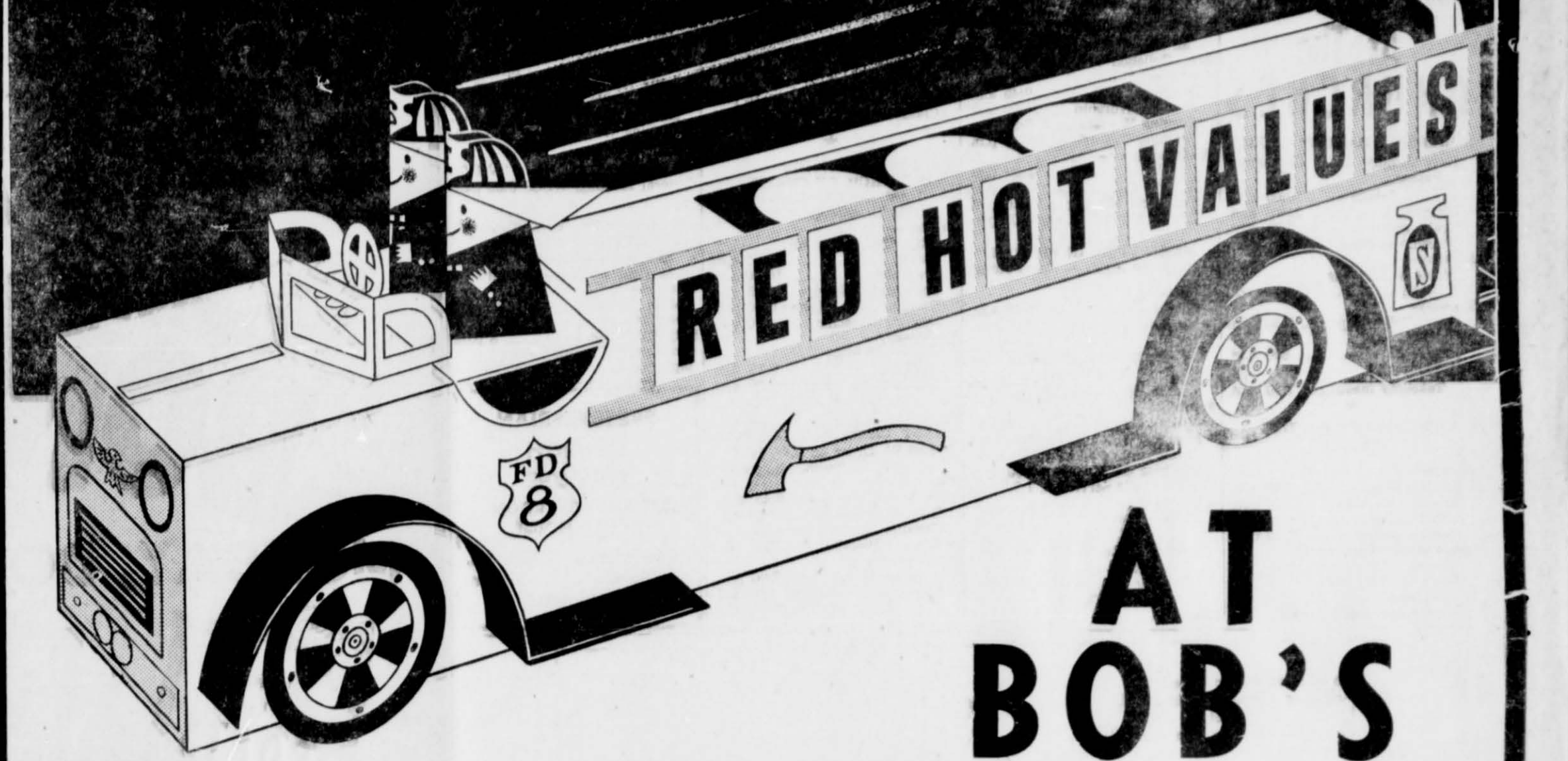

 While the national birth rate is steadily declining, the birth rate for Texas has remained fairly stable according to provisional data for the first six months of 1958, 1959 and 1960.

During the first six months of this year there were 110,996 live births in Texas — compared to 110,774 during the same period last year and 108,395 in the first half of 1958.

The birth rates for 1958 and 1959 were identical — 23.6 per 1,000 population.

However, during the first six months of 1960 it was only 23.2 per 1,000 which is a slight drop but still above the national average.

Another development indicated in the six months provisional statistical data is the "upturn" in the death rate for Texas.

For the past 15 years, the Texas death rate has declined steadily year after year, but so far in 1960 there has been an increase.

The death rate for the first six months is 8.3 per 1,000 population. The total deaths were 39,488.

In 1958 there were 36,630 deaths for a rate of 8.0 per 1,000 and in 1959 there were only 36,030 deaths indicating an all time low of 7.7 deaths per 1,000 population.

Accurately compiling statistical data for analysis by public health authorities is one of the major duties of the Records and Statistics Section of the Texas Department of Health.

By noting the decline in certain death figures, health authorities can gauge effectiveness of health programs or spot potential health trouble spots.

The Records and Statistics Section keeps all birth and death records for the state of Texas.

Social Security Figures Given

Federal Social Security is slowly but steadily supplanting state-federal Old Age Assistance as a source of income for elderly Texans.

Nearly half a million citizens of the State in the upper age bracket are drawing either Old Age and Survivors Insurance (social security) or Old Age Assistance, and about 45,000 receive both. At least 7 out of 10 old people get a monthly check from one or the other.

At present, the biggest need for indigent old people is low-cost medical care.

Mrs. William B. Ruggles, of Dallas, a member of the Texas Society on Aging, said the two questions most frequently asked by old people were: 1) Can anything be done to help us with the cost of medical care? 2) Is there any possibility of relief from the tax burden at the time of life when our incomes are so reduced?

The Texas homestead exemption does provide a measure of tax relief, but the burden of medical care grows heavier by year.

Federal Communications Commission

Something more than Warren Harding's normalcy began to enter American homes in the 1920's — it was radio, a delightfully new and thoroughly enchanting medium of communications destined within a few short years to revolutionize the nation's entertainment and news. With the aid of a simple crystal set and a pair of earphones, the early listener could hear a variety of sounds broadcast, in many cases, by business or educational institutions within range. The idea of a station independent within the community came later.

The first broadcasting was done on a shoestring, and since radio required only a fraction of what it does today, more and more stations went into operation. Soon two and even more broadcasters were trying to employ the same frequencies, with the result that listeners were treated only to a confusing chaotic mixture. Although it was recognized that the airwaves be controlling the bedlam which arose as stations began jumping all over the frequencies and raising their power at will.

Calvin Coolidge asked the Congress to do something, and in 1927 the Dill-White Radio Act was passed. This law established the Federal Radio Commission, which was to exert regulatory power in terms of licensing and personnel of the stations as well as frequency allocation and control of power. When this Commission came into being, there were 732 stations on the air. About 150 of them surrendered their licenses under the new law, and the Commission then devoted much of its time to straightening out those who were left.

Soon after Franklin Roosevelt assumed office in 1933, it was decided to combine the regulation of all communications in a single body. This would include not only radio, but telephone, telegraph, and — later — television as well. Some aspects of communications regulations had been administered by the Interstate Commerce Commission after its formation in 1887. The new Federal Communications Commission, which replaced the Radio Commission in 1934, accepted responsibility for applying the law to all forms of electrical communications.

The FCC does approximately the same things with telephone and telegraph companies (but not with radio and television) that the Federal Trade Commission does with business in general. It requires the maintenance of certain activities in the public interest and thus prevents, say, a telephone company from arbitrarily suspending a community's service. Telephone and telegraph companies cannot alter their interstate rates without the Commission's approval, nor may the companies, as public utilities, deny reasonable service to anyone.

Most of us are more closely involved with the FCC's regulation of commercial radio and television. Here the Commission's work falls into two major categories. First, it supervises the highly technical engineering and traffic problems such as construction of equipment, assignment of call letters on frequencies, hours of service, and amount of power a station may use in its signal. Since radio and television stations are not classed as common carriers there is no regulation of time changes, salaries, or profits.

Second, the FCC tries to insure that radio and television stations in the broadcast sense, are regulated for the public good. It does not censor programs, nor does it require that any certain types of programs be aired. Nevertheless, there is a fine line of distinction here in that broadcasters must secure renewal of their licenses every three years. The FCC can refuse this renewal if it believes the station has not lived up to its broadcasting responsibilities. It also applies standards of fairness under the law such as the famous equal time ruling on political broadcasts.

The future of FCC regulations may well present an even greater

Extension Service Program Explained

In a predominantly agricultural area such as Castro County the state extension service takes on importance as the medium of disseminating information about farming which has been obtained through experimentation, observation and practice.

In Dimmitt the local representatives of the state extension service are County Agent Charles Hottel and County Home Demonstration Agent Sybil G. Stringer. They are aided in their program by Area Farm and Home Management Specialists Mr. James Murphrey of Amarillo and Miss Mildred Webb of Lubbock.

The program for the local extension representatives is planned by local farm people who make up the Group meeting monthly from September to May. For 1961 the group has outlined programs on the following topics:

Analysis and evaluation of farm and home records; Information on income tax; analyzing family records as applied to income tax; buying and selling information; record keeping as applied to management; getting the most from the food dollar; managing family resources and capital management.

The extension service will carry out this program by bringing experts to the country to talk and consult on each count.

"Getting the Most from the food Dollar" by Miss Mildred Webb on February 27 at 1:30 p.m.

"Managing the Family Resources" on March 27 at 1:30 p.m.

All discussions are open to the public and are held in the assembly room of the court house.

challenge than has the past. Americans are coming to expect more and more of broadcasters in the type and scope of their programs. Furthermore, the need for more radio and television stations on standard dials is becoming increasingly acute and will eventually demand concerted attention. We can therefore expect that the FCC's regulatory functions will become a matter of even greater importance than they were when the Commission began its activities more than 25 years ago.
