### Wheat Premiums to be Paid for Better Baking Quality Grains

Premiums ranging from three to 24 cents per bushel for varying qualities of hard red spring, hard red winter and hard white wheat as measured by a baking quality (sedimentation) test have been announced by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Under the 1962 wheat price-support program, premiums will be paid on hard wheats with baking quality values of 40 or above on the quality scale. Wheats with a value of 40 or higher are preferred for commercial bread baking.

### ODE OF CONDUCT OR VICTORY
