Railroads Now Offer Family Budget Rates

Family plan fares for Pullman passengers on the Santa Fe Railway System will go into effect Sept. 21, according to an announcement made by R. T. Anderson, general passenger traffic manager today. Plans are being made to extend the family plan to all coach trains in the very near future, probably by Oct. 19.

Santa Fe is the first Western railroad to propose extension of the family fare plan for coach trains. This will include the famous economy streamliner to the Coast, El Capitan, The Texas Chief to Galveston, and the Kansas City Chief.

Pullman passengers on the famous Super Chief and Chief will benefit by the new plan as well as all other Pullman passengers using Santa Fe trains.

The plan provides that one parent pay full fare, the other half fare, and that half fares be paid for all members of the family between the ages of five and twenty-one years. The extra fares on such trains as the El Capitan, Super Chief and Chief will also be subject to family plan reduction. Departures are limited to Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.

China Gets Auto Plant

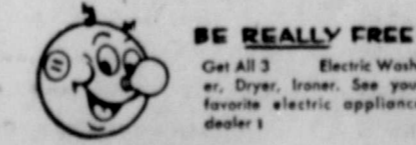

Serve with this delectable dressing: 1 cup real mayonnaise combined with 1 beaten egg white, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 2 tablespoons honey.

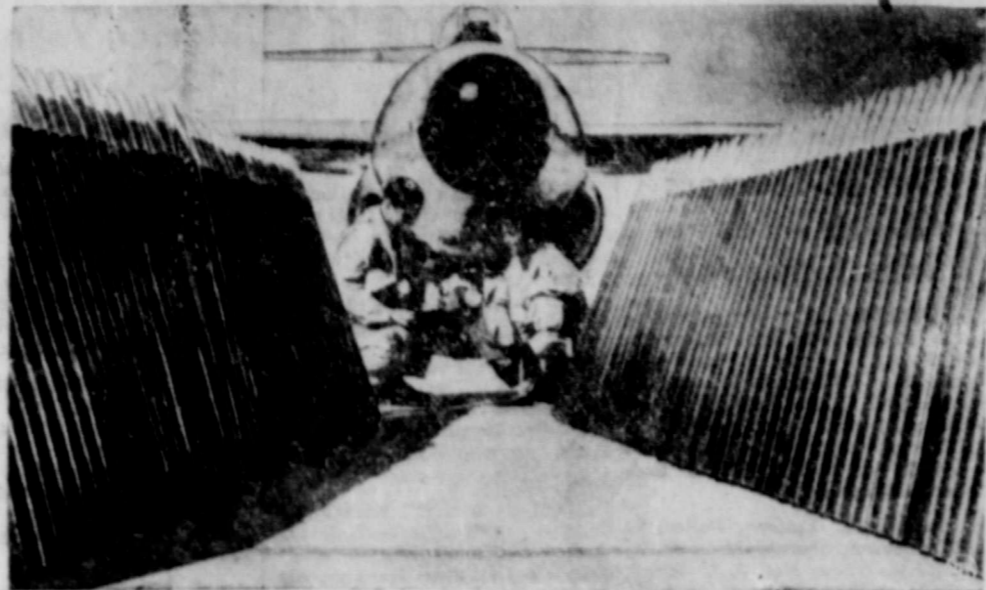

Polio Cases Are Dropping Over Nation

New cases of infantile paralysis reported last week totaled 2,130, the second straight week in which the number decreased from the preceding week.

"It now appears the peak for 1953 was reached in the week ended Aug. 22," the Public Health Service said Thursday in its weekly summary.

There were 2,238 cases listed in the week ended Aug. 29 and 2,251 in the week of Aug. 22.

Last year—a record polio year with 57,626 cases listed—saw the peak reached in the third week of September.

In the week ended Sept. 6, 1952, there were 3,817 cases, or 44 per cent more than the 2,130

In the first three months of 1953, American railroads installed 574 new locomotive units, of which all but five were driven by diesel fuel oil.

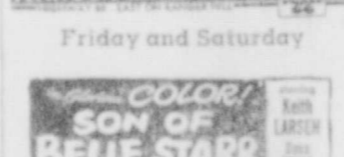

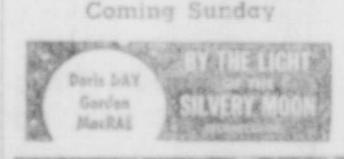
