## Russian Ruler Announced As Dead!! Alive??

A 1954 Cadillac automobile bearing foreign license plates identified by witnesses as from the state of Nuevo Leon in Old Mexico stopped at local restaurant this morning at approximately 1 o'clock bearing a man in the rear seat identified by witnesses as looking like Joe Stalin, former Russian Ruler who supposedly is dead.

A passing motorist from the same state in Mexico, Senor Loof Lipra, who also stopped at the cafe, glanced in the rear seat of the vehicle and at a press conference early this morning said he could be wrong but the man was not a Mexican and when the mystery occupant of the Cadillac notified his driver to go on after the brief stop, Senor Lipra reported that he did not give the orders in Spanish but in Russian.

Officers in this area were alerted in the early hours of the morning and road blocks were placed at Baird, Abilene, Sweetwater and San Angelo. Officers of the Texas Rangers are being flown into this area, a last minute check by Times Editor Bob Kelly revealed.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, officers of the State Department, and Army and Navy Intelligence, teams are being flown to Eastland county to comb this area for a possible clue as the car has not cleared the road block and officers believe that the mystery car is still in this area.

Senor Loof Lipra in a statement to the Editor of this paper stated that the gentleman that he has identified as Stalin remained in the car while the driver and possibly a body guard went into the establishment and purchased coffee. Coffee was served to the mystery man by the driver in the car.

Senor Loof Lipra stated that he had looked at numerous pictures of Stalin and that his description could not be wrong. The man, the senior remarked, wore the seal of Russia around his neck.

Senor Lipra remarked that he is not a frequent traveler, that he only comes through this area once a year and that is on the 1st of April. Loof Lipra spelled backwards and placed backwards is April Fool!

## Langford Will Face Jury Trial Monday Morning

A jury trial has been set for Monday for Neal Langford in Eastland County Juvenile Court before Judge John Hart. Langford is charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

A more serious charge of kidnapping filed against Langford has been dropped. Langford is accused of enticing a 14-year-old Ranger girl away from the custody of her parents.

## Colonel Brashier Takes Part in Army Maneuvers

ERNEST HARMON AFB, Nfld. (Sp.) — Pfc. Colonel D. Brashier, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Brashier, 209 East Plummer St., Eastland, recently took part in mock attack maneuvers held at Ernest Harmon Air Force Base, Newfoundland, to provide base personnel with practice in defensive tactics.

Both Army and Air Force personnel stationed at Harmon took part in the exercise, while participating as an aggressor force were 250 members of the XVIII Airborne Corps, 11th Airborne Division (Angels) and five C-124 aircraft of the Tactical Air Command's 18th Air Force.

The "chutists" were airlifted and then simulated an air drop on the base. Upon "landing" they moved in on the base but were met by a strong defensive force of which Pfc. Brashier was a member, the defensive force having been alerted for a possible attack.

A heavy snowfall in recent days gave the training exercise a definite arctic flavor with "troopers" and the defensive group maneuvering in the snow and ice and displaying their forces and fire power as strategy demanded.

Observers of the attack declared that the training exercise served its purpose well, lessons in both defensive and offensive methods being gained by both forces.

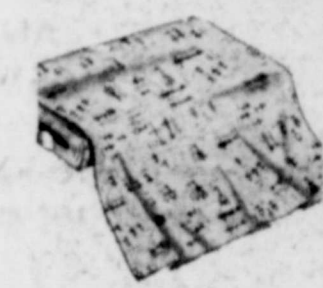

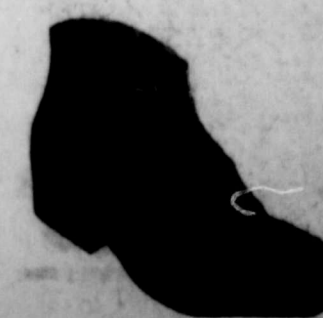

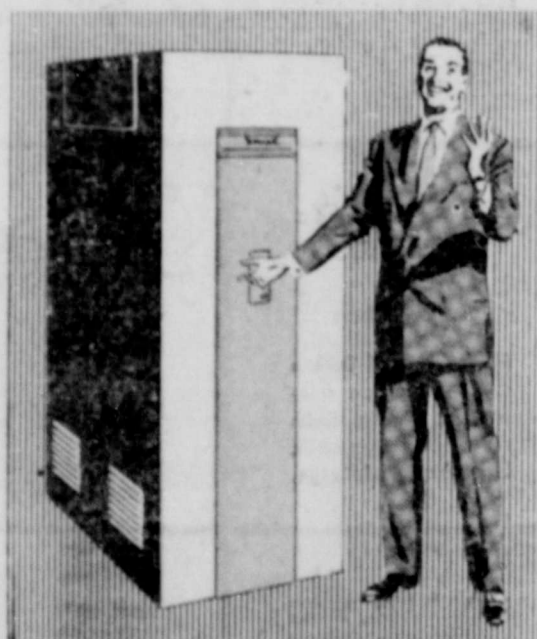

**Majestic Theatre To Introduce New CinemaScope In Eastland**

Moviewgoers will get their first view of CinemaScope, the new motion picture process which has caused a revolution in Hollywood studios even greater than that 27 years ago when pictures found their voice. This new process will be unveiled at the Majestic theatre in Eastland on April 11 with the showing of Knights of the Round Table.

In order to show this CinemaScope production, which covers a screen approximately two and one-half times wider than the customary motion picture size, the Majestic theatre will be reconstructed with a new panoramic screen and special projection equipment. The unveiling of this new motion picture form will be the most important event in area theatrical history, according to Corie Piere, manager of the theatre.

"CinemaScope achieves the illusion of depth without the use of glasses," Mr. Piere explained. "Its life-like, panoramic scope, plus stereophonic sound, combine to make the audience experience complete engulment and participation in the action.

"Actually, CinemaScope is a multiple process. It consists of an anamorphic lens, the Miracle-Mirror Screen and stereophonic sound.

The anamorphic lens returns to its original shape an image previously distorted. This lens makes it possible for a 35 mm. camera to 'reach out' to each side as the eye does and compress a wide angle scene on a narrow strip of film. When this film is projected through a compensating lens attached to the theatre projection machine it spreads the image horizontally to its original, or to an aspect ratio, of 2.55 to 1.

"The Miracle Mirror Screen with millions of tiny 'lenses' reflecting greater light is an all-purpose

fidelity sound system, uses four sound tracks which, when wired to speakers strategically placed in the theatre, correspond to sound emanating from the actual persons or locations on the CinemaScope screen, affording an unusually natural and realistic effect.

A single stereophonic sound system has been developed which

places the four sound tracks on the same strip of 35 mm. film which carries the photographic image. Because of its simplicity, the prevention of non-synchronization and economy of operation, this single sound system has been hailed by technicians and film industry leaders as another revolutionary advancement in motion picture making."
