"Following the outset of 'total war' last May, Mr. Harman said "the American Red Cross asked the pullic for a fund of \$20,000,000 to widen its war relief operations in Europe. This amount has been raised and oversubscribed, enabling the Red Cross to ship thousands of tons of food, clothing and medical supplies to the har zone areas where it has been most

Differentiating from the needs of European war relief, Mr. Harman stated that the Red Cross Roll Call is held each year to support the national and local Red Cros organizations in their domestic opera tions. S. Army Medical Corps. In addition, experimental studies are being made for U. S. Military in time of emergency. The latter program, Harman said, was being run as a parallel project to a program of furnish-

"At the same time, the Red Cross must be prepared to continue the work of its services.' Mr. Harman saidd. Nearly 380,000 persons received certificates in First Aid and 94,000 in Life Saving during the past year. Indications point to an even greater training program for 1941.






