

Texas property owners had \$2, 527,778,000 of their mortgage fin ancing needs extended to them by life insurance companies the country at the start of this year, the Institute of Life Insur ance reports. These real loans covered 298,100 individual mortgages in the state and repre ented an increase of \$1,328,455, 000 in four years.

Of the total mortgages outstanding in Texas with the life com-19,680 for \$247,340,000 were or farms; 91,890 for \$642,314,000 were on non-farm FHA insured omes; 82,100 for \$452,758,000 were on non-farm properties un der guarantee by the Veteran Veteran nistration; and 104,430 for \$1,185,366,000 were on other non-farm properties. The last classifi-cation included both urban housng directly financed by the con panies under conventional mortg ages and commercial properties.


