

Eastland Deer Hunters Report Successful Hunts

Deer hunters in the Eastland area have been doing okay for themselves so far, a spot check revealed Tuesday.

At least nine deer have been killed, and many more hunters have probably got their bucks that have not yet been added to the

Probably the most successful hunter in Eastland today is Charles Freyschlag Jr. Freyshclag bagged two bucks the first day to end his hunting season in







New Chemical Being Tested On Bollworm

COLLEGE STATION-A por sible powerful new tool against the bollworm is being tested by entomologists at Texas A&M Col-

The new chemical is an organic phosphorus compound whose exact chemical description has not yet been released by the makers.

Seven test applications of the chemical were made in comparison with DDT during September and early October. Average tabu-lations of damaged bolls and worms found were:

Check plots with no treatment, 31.1 injured bolls and 50.9 worms; DDT plots at treatment rate of 1 ½ pounds of active ingredient per acre, 20,5 injured bolls and 31.7 worms; DDT plots at a threepound rate, 23.8 bolls and 32.8 worms; and the new chemical, 5.16
