Spread Chocolate Frosting between layers, over top and sides of cake, and over tops of yellow cupcakes. Prepare Butter Almond Prosting. Put a little of this in a paper cornucopia to write "Happy Birthday" across top of cake, (If frosting is too soft to use in tube, add a little confectioners' sugar.) Spread rest of Butter Almond Frosting on chocolate cupcake. Chocolate Frosting. Measure 6 cups sifted confectioners' sugar.

Cream 6 tablespoons butter; add part of sugar gradually, blending well. Mix in % teaspoon sait and 4 aquares unsweetened chocolate, melted. Add rest of sugar, alternately with about % cup milk, until of right consistency to spread, beating until smooth.

Butter Almond Frosting. Measure 2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar. Cream ¼ cup butter; add part of sugar gradually, blending well. Add dash of salt. 
