

"But we cannot wait until then for planning for the protection of as many of our children as possi-ble. Vaccinating large numbers of children is a big and important job, entailing many procedural tasks that can't be performed overnight. If the license is granted n April, we must be ready to start vaccinating at once, so that, if ossible, we can finish before our schools close and the polio seasor starts.
