





A fine treat for folks who love desserts but are a "little" chubby is this grape cooler recommended by home economists. Dissolve one envelope strawberry gelatin in 3-4 cup hot water and add 1-4 cup grape juice. Pour into molds and chill until firm in the refrigerator. Unmold - makes 2 or 3 portions, 1-2 or 1-3 cup each.






