TAX KICK-BACK

Eastland County Precincts To Split \$30,862 For Work

The four Eastland County precincts will divide \$30,862.59 for road improvement and upkeep as the result of the state one-cent gasoline tax.
 County Judge John Hart received a check for that amount Monday, representing the return to the county as its part from the revenue taken in by the tax.
 A total of \$7,300.00 is being distributed to Texas' 254 counties. The tax is collected to retire outstanding Road District Bonds, that were assumed by the Board of County Bond Indebtedness several years ago.
 Several counties did not have bonds to assume and will receive their entire share.

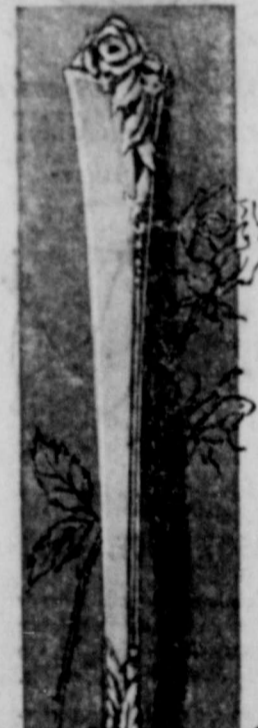

Sunday, Sept. 17th and Sunday, Sept. 24th, have been designated as CROP Sundays.

Ministers in Eastland County have been asked to use one of these two Sundays to speak a few minutes about CROP.

CROP is the Christian Rural Overseas Program.

CROP is the community food and self-help appeal of the churches, national, state and local.

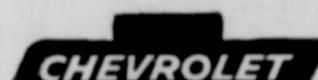

Jury Finds for Lowrance In Eastland Ranchers' Trial

An all-male jury decided in favor of L. A. Lowrance Jr. in 91st District Court in Eastland, in a suit in which Ira L. Hanna was attempting to collect \$5,800 which he claimed was due him in payment for cattle.

The jury answered "None" to the special issue which asked: "How many mother cows, if any, do you find from a preponderance of the evidence, that the defendant (Lowrance) failed to account to the Plaintiff (Hanna) for, if any, under the contract entered into between the plaintiff and the defendant in the fall of 1958."

Hanna claimed that Lowrance owed him for 32 mother cows, valued at \$125 each (\$4,000) plus one-third profit from the anticipated 94 head of calves valued at \$5,400, of which one-third equals \$1,800, making an overall total of \$5,800 asked plus interest at six per cent.

Hanna, who ranches south of Eastland, and Lowrance, who ranches north of Eastland, entered into an agreement in 1958 in which Hanna furnished a number

of head of cattle which Lowrance was to feed and care for, and at time of sale, was to return to Hanna the original cost of the cattle plus one-third of the profits from the sale of cattle and offspring.

The case was the first jury-heard trial in Judge T. M. Collier's present 91st District Court session. Frank Sparks represented Lowrance and Allen D. Dabney represented Hanna.

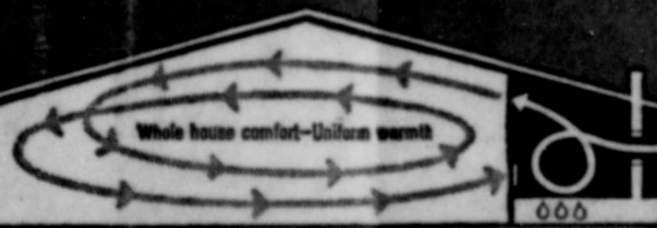

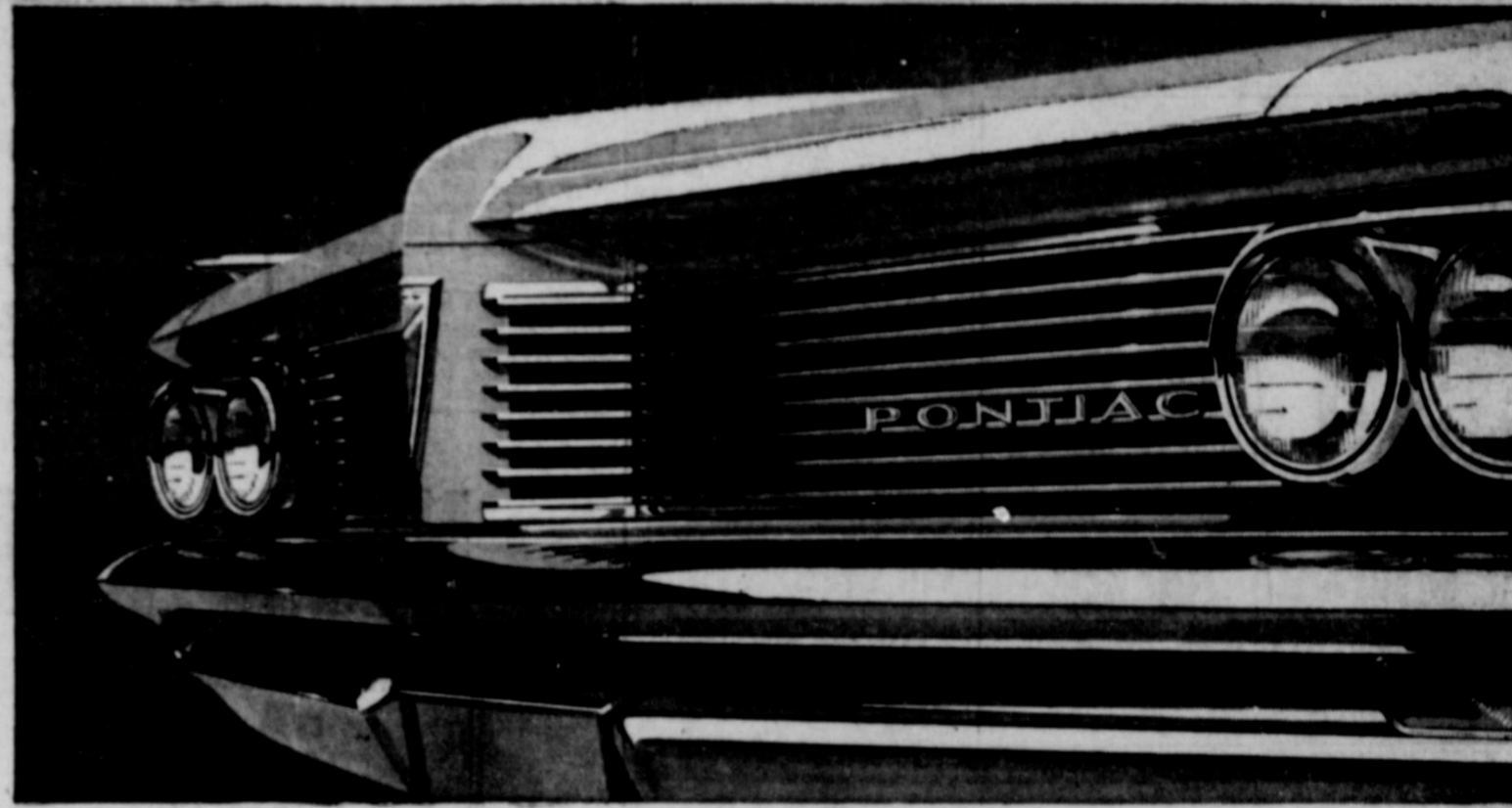

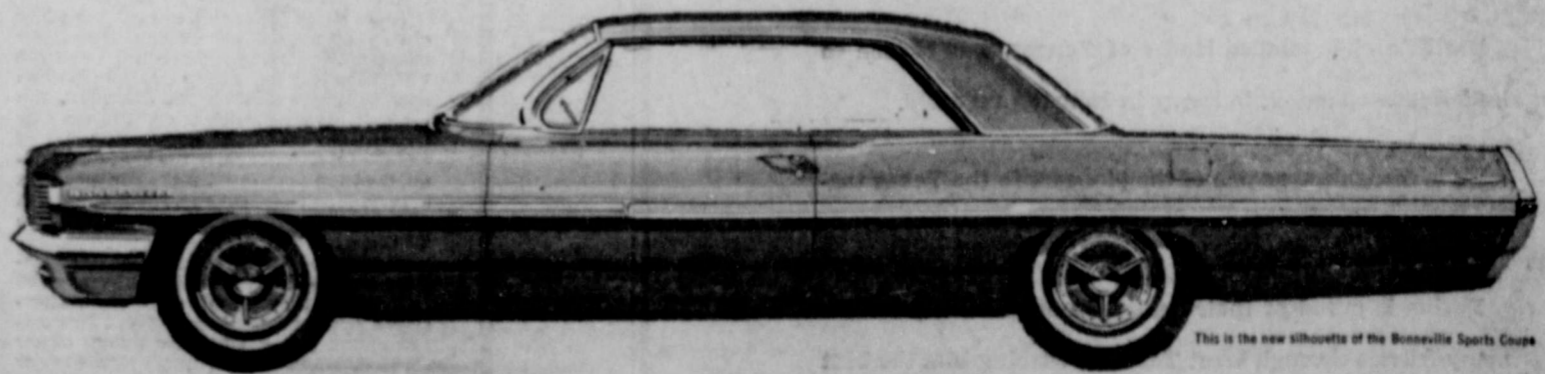
