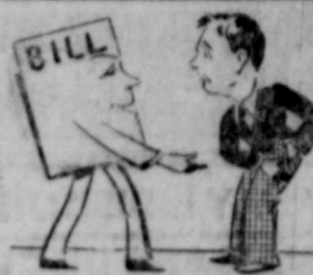

law legalizing parimutuel wagering on horse races with the State and the tract (sic) sharing fourteen (14) per cent of the parimutuel pool, the home-county receiving two (2) per cent of the total pool, and all other counties receiving one-half of the net State share on the basis of population. No racing on Sunday.

The third proposition, concerning poll taxes, will read, with "for" and "against" choices:

"The Legislature to submit a Constitutional Amendment to abolish the poll tax as a prerequisite for voting."
