Authorities said that Mrs. Jones and Splawn had lived in California until shortly before the robery, although Mrs. Jones had resided in Eastland at one time several years prior to that time.

Several months after the robbery, the two were arrested in Idaho but escaped from jail there before being turned over to Eastland authorities. Mrs. Jones, who was nude at the time of the jail break, developed a severe case of poison ivy, she said. After being recaptuered they were transferred to the Eastland County jail on July 28. 

THE BIBLE:

There are no living witnesses to whom we can turn and inquire. "Is the Bible the inspired word of God?" We must turn to the Bible itself and from its own claims accept it as Divine, absolute truth or accept the consequences upon denial of such.

In II Timothy 3:16-17, Paul says, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproff, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." The word "Inspiration" literally means "God breathed." All scripture is "God breathed" and notice, it is profitable for; doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness. What does it lack? Nothing. It is all of this in order that the man of God may be perfect (complete) thoroughly (completely) furnished unto all good works. If the word of God can make a man complete what else does he need? Can man add something that will make himself more complete than the word can?

The Bible claims to be the inspired word of God. Either it is or it is not - there is no middle position! If it is the word of God then it can do what it says it can and we need nothing else. If it isn't the inspired word of God then it is a LIE! If it is a lie then it is the product of Satan and we should not abide by its principles.

Make your decision. If it is the inspired word of God then it is the perfect and complete will of God capable of furnishing all of man's spiritual needs. If it is not the inspired word of God then it is a lie and all of its principles of truth are based on a lie, BE-CAUSE IT CLAIMS TO BE THE INSPIRED WORD OF GOD.




