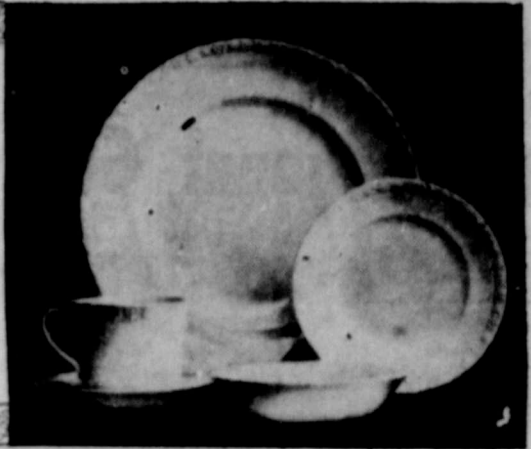

Annual Active Duty...

County National Guard Unit Set To Leave Next Sunday For Hood

Cisco National Guardsmen, Battery C, Third Battalion, 132nd Artillery will leave by convoy at 9 a.m. Sunday, June 21, for two weeks at summer camp and active duty training at Fort Hood near Killeen.

The group will be stationed there until July 5. The first week will be devoted to the fast and individual training in the Fort Hood area, and the second week will be spent in the field, learning to fire the basic weapon, the 155 mm howitzer.

On the first Saturday, June 27th, a parade of the entire division will be held for Governor John Connally.

Miss 49th Armored Division of 1964 will be selected and crowned while the National Guard division is in training at Fort Hood and will make her first public appearance during the division's annual motorized review.

Selection of the 49th Division Sweetheart at camp is a change in past procedure, when she was chosen by photograph prior to summer field training.

Miss 49th Armored Division of 1964 will be selected in per-

son from contestants representing each battalion and separate company—about 30 in all—by a panel of civilian judges at Fort Hood.

Each of the 105 units in the division are currently selecting their "company sweetheart" who will in turn, vie for battalion honors.

Sweetheart of the Third Battalion from this area is Miss Claudette Spain chosen May 20 sponsored by Battery C to compete in division competition.

Miss Spain is 18 years old, a student at Abilene Christian College, and the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Carl Spain. Dr. Spain is a professor at Abilene Christian College.

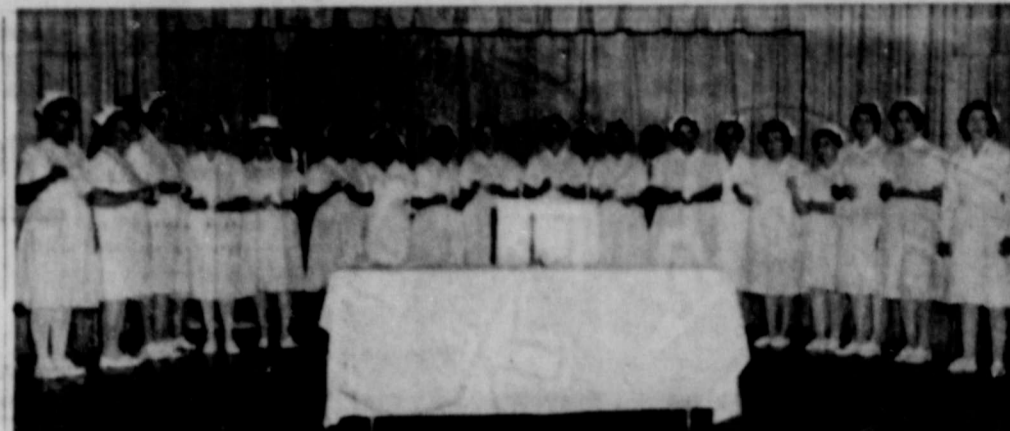
