Beginning at 9 a. m., the Prison Rodeo's Midway comes alive as convicts present Dunk a Convict, Dart Mart, Wanted Posters, Parole Certificates, Art Sales, A Medicine Show and many other side shows, plus the best convict musical aggregations.

At 1 p. m., inside the Prison Stadium, convicts go through their paces in a one-hour show featuring The Rustlers, Jug Band, The Vagabonds, The Goree Girls, and the prison's own military band.

On Sunday, Oct. 22, the featured attraction will be Buck Owens and his Buckaroos, plus Floyd Tillman, popular country song writer and singer.

Also on the bill will be Candy Barr, a former inmate, who will sing and dance accompanied by inmate musicians. Candy is currently doing a stint as a night club entertainer on the Las Vegas scene.

To round out the fast-moving two-hour show, 47 of the prison's toughest cowboys will match their talents with tough er broncs and charging Brahma bulls in a host of thrilling crowd-pleasing rodeo events.

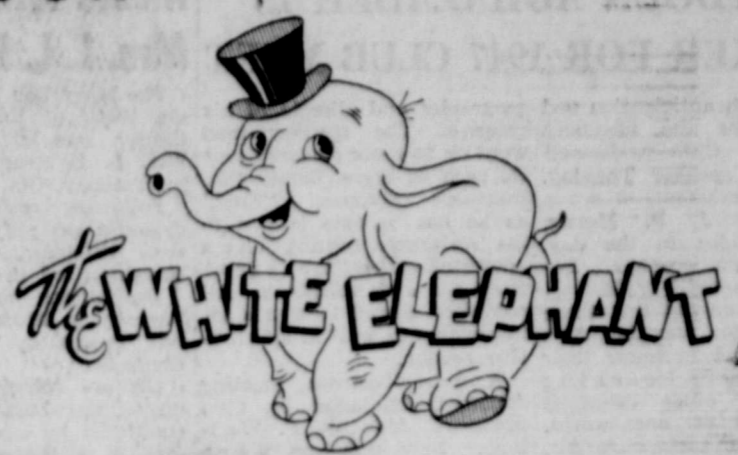
