

Q-I'm a college student My draft board deferred me in Class II-S Nov. 25, 1966, until Nov. 1, 1967. I've been told that, because of this, if my wife and I should have a child, I could not be deferred for the child because I was placed in Class II-S. Is this

A—It is not. The board took classification action be-fore July 1, 1967. If the board takes action after July 1, 1967. to classify you again in Class III-S, then you may not be deferred thereafter in Class III-A as a father.

Q Is there any written material available about aparents.

A—A pamphle t, "Taking Appeals from Selective Service Classifications," is available without charge at State Selective Service Headquarters, or at draft boards.






