## First State Bank Will Hold Formal Open House Sunday

The 5,000 square feet of floor space in the new First State Bank building, W. Main and Commerce, will be open for public viewing during the bank's open house from 2-5 p. m. Sunday, announced bank president Glyn Gilliam.

Scheduled to be on hand are L. D. White of the Fort Worth architect firm that drew plans for the building; designer Willard Reavis of the Fort Worth firm; general contractor L. E. Jones of Brownwood; directors, officers and employees of the bank.

Refreshments and souvenirs will be available, President Gilliam said.

New services that have been added to the bank since it moved to its new abode Jan. 29, is a pass book savings department and a drive-in window.

The new brick and glass structure contains a larger lobby than did the bank's former home across the street. Paneling and much of the furniture is walnut. Throughout the building, blue and orange enliven the furnishings. Beige draperies adorn the windows.

The building contains 565 safety deposit boxes, larger than those in the older bank building, and two vaults.

Each teller cage is equipped with a safe.

A Community Room will be available as a meeting place for local organizations. A snack bar is convenient for the employees.

When a parking lot on the east side of the bank is completed, President Gilliam said, parking space for approximately 30 cars will be available.

Construction of the new plant commenced last June. The name was changed from "Commercial State" to "First State" in December.

## Salary for Assistant DA Expected to Be Questioned

Indications are that there may be some opposition to the paying of an assistant county attorney a salary of \$500 a month, according to reports in the Eastland County Court house Friday.

County Attorney Perry T. Brown has appointed Emory J. Walton, an Abilene assistant city attorney, assistant Eastland County attorney, and the County Commissioner's Court Monday approved the appointment and set Mr. Walton's salary at \$500 a month. The young man is expected to report Feb. 26, Mr. Brown said Friday.

However reports in the courthouse indicate that there are some who believe the amount of the salary is too high, while they do not object to the hiring of the assistant to assist with the work load of the county attorney's office.

Mr. Brown and others did extensive research, primarily through the state attorney general's office, to determine the salaries on payment for assistant attorneys. In a report to the commissioners court, Mr. Brown cited the various laws which apply, and held that the \$500-a-month salary is legal.

Also doing legal-book looking several other county officials are of the opinion that a salary of \$3,600 a year is all permitted under law for the salary of a new assistant is believed to stem from the fact that county officials have not received a pay increase in some ten years, and from the fact that some officials have requested additional help and been told that extra help or salary boosts couldn't be afforded by the county without tax increases.

Mr. Brown said Friday that he is looking forward to retirement after the completion of his term at the end of the year.

No one filed as a candidate for the combination county-district attorney's office for the May 4 primary, therefore it is assumed that upon Mr. Brown's retirement at the end of his term, it will fall to the of the county commissioner's court to appoint a successor.

And there also appears to be a question on that point too — some hold that in the event that there are no candidates for an office, the office holder retains his office until "his successor is qualified" (that is, elected, makes bond and takes the oath).

And so it goes, under the roof of the Eastland County Courthouse.

## Father, Son Charged With Theft of Wire

A 46-year-old Azle man and his 20-year-old son were in Eastland County Jail Tuesday morning, each charged with two counts of theft of copper wire.

Bonds of \$2,500 on each count had been set against each man on each count by Justice of the Peace Wells Dalton, and those were made Tuesday.

The father, Albert Rowe Bright, was arrested early on Sunday morning about four miles northwest of Gorman on the Katy Railroad right-of-way, with approximately 400 pounds of wire in his pickup camper.

Two strands had been cut from the Humble Pipeline Co. communications line to Houston, and one strand had been cut from poles utilized by the Katy and Western Union Telegraph.

Estimates are that the sale value of the wire is something like 70 cents a pound, Sheriff L. E. Sublett, who was in charge of the investigation, reported. S. G. Clary of Cisco, Humble communication's representative, first detected the breakdown in the lines, and reported to Sheriff Sublett.

Disturbance in the lines was first noted last Friday night, and the sheriff department and other officials began working the line.

Assisting in the investigation were Eastland Policemen Richard Arnold, Sheriff's Deputy Loy Williams, Gorman Constable Albert White, LCB Agent L. D. Adams, Highway Patrolmen Jack Therwanger and Don Alexander.

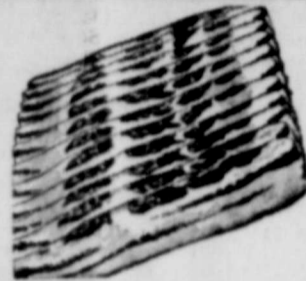
