



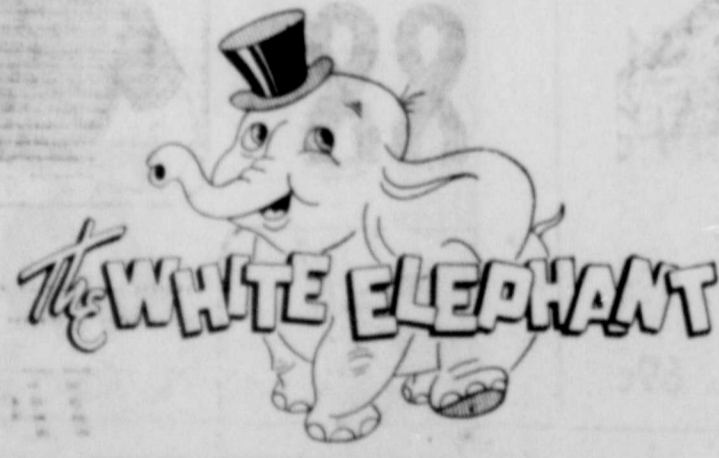

# Sen. Yarborough Puts Okay on Don

 U.S. Sen. Ralph Yarborough, making public a declaration of his preference for Don Yarborough for governor by paying a personal visit to Yarborough's campaign headquarters Sunday morning, predicted D. Yarborough will win the runoff "going away."  
 The senator came down the stairs of D. Yarborough's Austin headquarters carrying a Yarborough campaign sign, with a V for Victory sign to declare, "We're on the side of electing the first loyal Democratic governor since Jimmy Allred was governor 30 years ago. The people of Texas are entitled to elect a governor at least once every 30 years."  
 As the D. Yarborough staffers and supporters cheered, the senator continued, "Folks, you don't know how wonderful it's going to be. You're going to think flowers are blooming in January this year. I wouldn't be surprised to see strawberries ripening in January."  
 The senator said he had never led into a runoff in a gubernatorial race, and said in 1956 when he ran for governor he was 150,000 votes behind going in the runoff.  
 "In the runoff I was so close I took 'em two weeks to count me out of it," he recalled.  
 People Saturday night, Sen. Yarborough said, have been telling Don Yarborough that although they worked as county managers for Hill and Briscoe "we're putting our shoulders to the wheel Monday morning for Don Yarborough for governor."  
 The senator reasoned "all the shrewd campaigners are out of it now."  
 It appeared obvious the senator feels Yarborough will attract, among other supporters of Hill and Briscoe

And it could work like this: the governor is expected to request that the legislature increase the state sales tax to three per cent on a uniform basis, to suspend the municipal sales tax, and to share the added one per cent increase with cities on a percentage basis.  
 Local citizens might object to the added one per cent state sales tax, but not quite as much if the city sent it back for city needs. If all this were to come to pass, it could mean several thousand additional dollars in revenue for the city annually.  
 The City of Eastland has not called for an election on the Municipal Sales Tax because it was decided by local officials that the city could get by without one at this time. Most other cities in Texas have voted the city tax.

City Manager Lewis Tiner furnishes the following material supplied by Judson F. Williams, president of the Texas Municipal League:  
 "Within the past week, a number of stories concerning the Governor's revenue plans for the state have appeared in several newspapers. Many of these stories, while based substantially on fact, were incomplete, just as the Governor's tax plan is still incomplete, and were probably not wholly accurate with respect to details. The purpose of this letter is to clarify the plan as it affects cities, as well as the role of the League in the tax matters now being discussed.  
 "Representatives of Texas cities and the Texas Municipal League for several weeks have had some knowledge of the general need for additional state revenue and of possible approaches to securing it. A group of about 30 mayors and councilmen met with the Governor, at his request, on this subject and others in April.

"Since the subject of taxes is now in the public domain, I want city officials to be as aware of plans and developments, particularly as they regard the municipal sales tax, as my tentative knowledge can make them. I think it is necessary that we view the legitimate needs for state revenue helpfully if possible and certainly in an unobstructive manner if the interests of cities are not harmed.  
 "The final form of the Governor's tax plan has not been released, but as outlined in our meeting with him last month, part of the plan would affect cities, and we have every reason to believe it would affect them beneficially. Simply stated, the Legislature will be asked to increase the state sales tax to 3 percent on a uniform basis, to suspend the municipal sales tax, and to share the 1 percent increase with cities on a percentage basis that in practically every instance will produce more for the cities than the present municipal sales tax.  
 "I stated flatly in a press conference following the April meeting with Governor Connally that cities do not want the municipal sales tax disturbed or repealed peremptorily. The Governor, perhaps better than anyone, knows that cities will give their sup-

port to any state program they believe to be needed, but he also knows that cities will not support, and the TML will not endorse, any plan that shuts off their vital new revenue source without replacing and protecting it.  
 "I am confident that the Governor's plan as presently conceived is economically sound and that it would solve

many of the problems of administration and compliance connected with the municipal sales tax. Most important, I am confident it is in the best financial interest of cities.  
 "The TML Board will consider the whole matter in detail when it meets June 6 in El Paso, shortly after the special session of the Legislature convenes on June 4. We

will keep you informed of developments and in the meantime any thoughts you have on the subject will be appreciated.

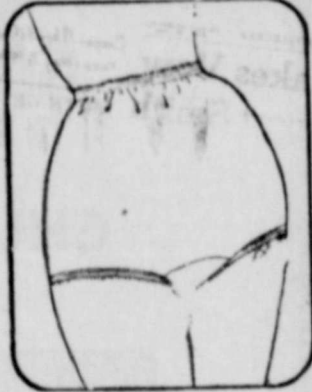

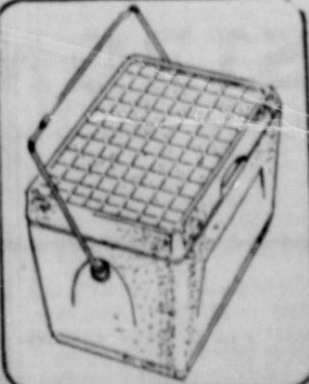

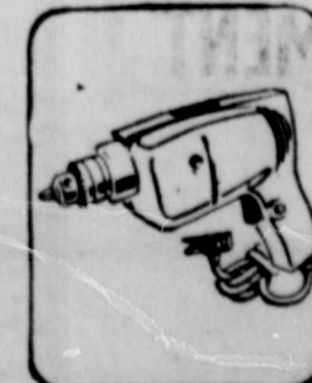

## 3 Picked Over Sabanno Shed Oil and Gas Wells Prove \$2.3 Million Yearly In This County For Priority

The Sabanno Watershed project failed to receive its top priority, according to word received in Eastland Tuesday.

Watershed President Ross Wilson of Gorman said in a letter to County Judge Scott Bailey that only three projects were given priority by the State Board, and that the Sabanno was among the top six considered.

It is possible, he explained in the letter, that the Sabanno could be selected for priority in the next batch picked, sometime in the next six to 12 months.

The extra-large Sabanno project has been approved, but competed with other projects to earn a tip priority position, necessary for funds and work startage.

Three that were chosen are Lipan, El Paso and Van Horn area waterflood projects. It was reported that Sabanno's application received very favorable consideration in view of the fact that it was an initial application.

The board picked three rather than six, as had been announced, and had one more been picked, it was believed that it would have been Sabanno, it was said.

## Oil and Gas Wells Prove \$2.3 Million Yearly In This County

Oil and gas wells provide approximately \$2.3 million a year of Eastland County's economic output, according to statistics released this week by Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association.

Based on most recent U. S. Bureau of Mines production figures, the Association compilation showed that Eastland County produced crude oil valued at \$1.5 million in 1966 and natural gas worth \$833,000.

Texas oil production in 1967, responding to demands for more domestic crude as a result of the Israeli-Arab conflict, totaled 1,050,000,000 barrels, a statewide increase over 1966 of about 5 percent. Production last year varied widely among state regions.

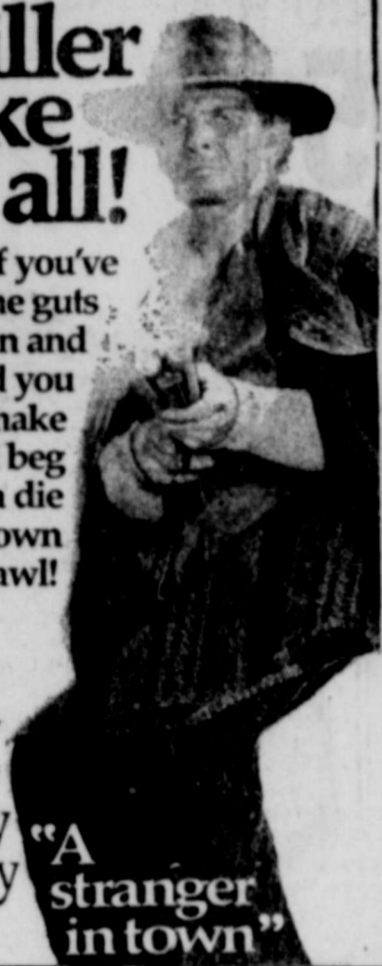

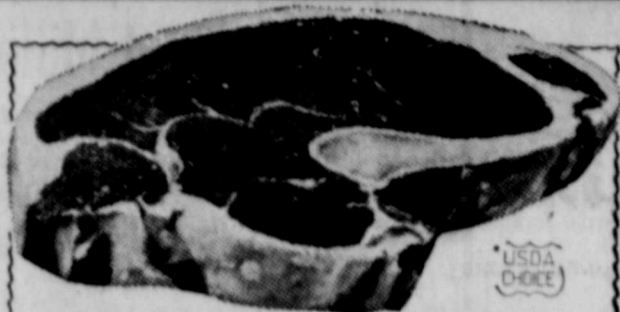
