30 Indictment Bills Returned

The Grand Jury returned 30 indictments Wednesday after three days of deliberations, 91st District Court Clerk Roy Lane announced.

Indictments included one for swindling with worthless check and theft by false pretext; one DWI, second offense; three for theft of copper wire; four for theft over \$50; two for theft of cattle; 12 for burglary; 2 for theft of automobile; two for passing forged instrument; two for robbery; and one for defrauding with worthless check and theft by false pretense.

The Gordon Spot . . .

Tour Indicates Good Peanut Crop For Area

Thirty-three men met at the Pioneer Farmers Coop on Oct. 30 and went with us on a peanut tour. Most of these

West Cross Timers Experiment Station in Stephenville; James Denton, Extension Farm Management Specialist from Stephenville; and John Galloway, Farm Editor for Radio Station KBWD in Brownwood.

I think everyone was impressed with the good crop prospects we saw in the tour. We saw dry land peanuts that should produce over 50 bushels per acre at J. T. Biggs' and Conrad Schaefer's. Conrad also had the best crop of grain sorghum I have seen in Eastland County. Several of the men guessed at the yields. The guesses ranged from 2-

000 pounds to 4,000 pounds per acre.

The double row peanuts at Cowan Hutton's and Edwin Schaefer's caused a lot of interest.

There were disagreements as to when the peanuts should be dug. At each stop some men said they would dig these peanuts in a few days if the crop was theirs. Others said they would leave them three weeks to a month before digging.

Edwin Schaefer is one who believes in leaving the peanuts until they are 130 to 140 days old which is much longer than most farmers want to wait. It's hard to argue with Edwin. His peanuts graded 79 last year and produced high yields. He said he has about crop when it is harvested. He leaves them in the ground as long as possible to make as much as he can. Some farmers have trouble with Southern blight and have to dig before the peanuts start coming off.

The most pleasant surprise of the tour was at Drew Dan Jackson's. His wife and Mrs. Herman Schaefer had cold drinks, hot coffee, cookies and cake waiting for the men on the tour. After four hours of riding and walking in the sand the brownies and drinks sure were good.

Drew Dan also showed us a real good peanut crop.

A beef cattle short course has been planned for all beef producers in Eastland County Oct. 15, 16 and 17. It will be held at the Farm Bureau building east of Eastland on Highway 80. Each session starts at 8 p. m. On Tuesday night, L. A. Maddox, Extension Animal Husbandman, will discuss animal breeding. He plans to cover crossbreeding which is causing a lot of discussion among cattlemen.

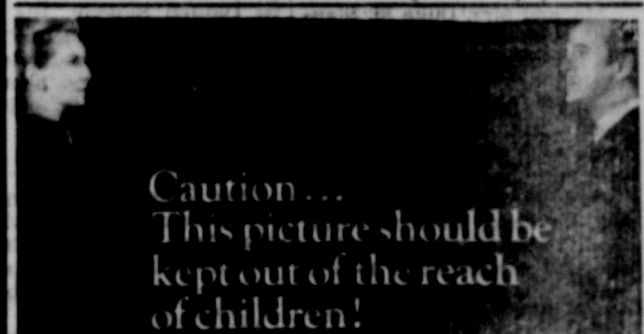

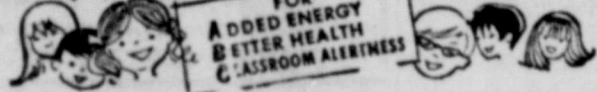
