Work on New FM Road Is Reported Developing
Progress on the Farm-to-market road from U.S. Highway 80 in Eastland, northward to U. S. 183 is progressing satisfactorily and work could begin this summer, R. T. Magness of the Texas Highway Dept. told Eastland City Commissioners Monday evening.

Delivering maps and giving a progress report, Magness explained that the city's right-of-way responsibility in the project will involve only a small 15 by 22 foot strip on College St.

The proposed project, which is to be a first-class FM road, 24 feet wide, with extra-heavy base, will leave U. S. 80 at College St. on the west side of town, and proceed along the Hollywood Vassarotti plant, go between houses, (west of its present winding location, cross the M&P Railroad Tracks at the same crossing, then swing left to clear the Texas Lighthouse Aggregate plant (haydite plant) and a new bridge will be built south of the existing bridge over the Lake Eastland leg, and proceed to the T intersection, taking the Yellow Mound Road, pass the Varge Daniel place, and tying into Highway 183.

Damage Suit Against Safeway Is Dropped

L. D. Hollingshead 44, of Brownwood, dropped his \$50,000 suit against Safeway Stores Inc. of Dallas Monday afternoon after testimony had commenced in Abilene federal court.

Hollingshead had sued the supermarket chain, claiming one of its trucks was responsible for an April 19, 1968, accident, in which he said he suffered a neck injury.

The Brownwood man testified a car backed into a Safeway truck at a courthouse square intersection.

After Hollingshead withdrew his suit, a jury of seven men and five women was dismissed. His attorney, W. L. Burke Jr. of Abilene, explained: "We just couldn't show that it was a Safeway truck."

The car which backed into Hollingshead was driven by W. J. Parten of Eastland. A year ago 91st District Court jury at Eastland ruled against Hollingshead in a \$20,000 suit against Parten.

Charges On File In Two Counties

Three Cisco youths were in the Eastland County jail today after their arrest over the weekend on charges in connection with the abduction of a Cisco Junior College coed last Thursday night at Lake Cisco Park.

In custody were LeRoy Mangum, 18, and Kendall Seabourn, 19, both natives of Cisco, and Woodrow Raper, 18, who moved to Cisco several months ago from California.

District Attorney Emory Walton filed charges against the three youths last Saturday night in Justice of the Peace W. L. Lewis' court in Cisco, charging them with armed robbery and abduction of a female. Bond was set at \$5,000 for each of the trio.

On Monday, officials filed charges of rape against the three in Stephens County at Breckenridge. The charges were filed by Don Ragland, Stephens County sheriff, in Justice J. W. Dodds' court. Bond was set at \$25,000 for each of the youths.

Officers said that the three youths held up a CJC youth and his date at Lake Cisco after midnight Thursday. They tied up the boy and left with his car and the girl. She was released some two and a half hours later.

Officers learned that two of the trio raped the girl. The car and the girl were released at the Highway 183-Highway 6 "Y" in Stephens County and she drove to Cisco. A police search for the trio followed.

Mangum and Raper eluded officers who chased them for a time and spent two day and nights in their cars in the woods of Stephens County, officers said. Sunday night they came home to Cisco and relatives took them to Sheriff L. E. Sublett in Eastland.

District Attorney Walton reported Tuesday that the case would go to the grand jury in Eastland County during the first week in February. He was not sure whether they would be tried first in Eastland or Stephens County.

Armed robbery and kidnapping could carry the death penalty as well as the rape charge, officials said.

Members of the immediate families and close friends attended the ceremony and reception which followed in the home of the bride's parents.

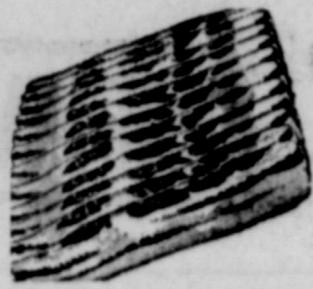
A white cashmere coat with matching mink collar completed the bride's ensemble for a wedding trip.

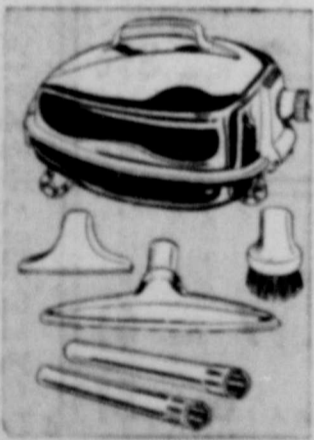
