Hospital Committees Give Reports at Saturday Meet

On Saturday, February 22, a meeting of the local hospital committee was held in the board room of the Ranger Junior College. Bill Marslander, chairman, presided at the meeting and heard reports from the following sub-committees:

Mr. Felton Brasher, Sr., Chairman of the committee to locate a site for the hospital, reported that he had met Friday, Feb. 21 with Mr. Collier of the Texas State Health Department, at which time six sites were appraised. Mr. Col-

lier objected one site because of its location on a hill and the committee rejected two sites because of the high price the owners placed on the land. Three sites are still under study.

Dr. E. W. Mince, Chairman of the Plans Committee, recommended approval of a 36 bed hospital which would cost an estimated \$850,000.

Mr. Glyn Gilliam, finance chairman, reported that he had visited HUD offices in Dallas and a bond company during the week and that his committee would be ready to render a recommendation for financing in the near future.

Mr. Marslander asked that all committees move as fast as

possible due to the May 31 deadline in applying for Government funds under the Hill Burton program. Half of the total cost of the hospital could be provided by a federal grant under this program.

The next meeting of the hospital committee will be held on call by the chairman.




