'Two A Penny' -- A Review

This time, I said, there will be no ships of memory. I will cover this film preview with every gimmick the computer age can supply. So I armed myself with a tiny battery recorder, a fresh tape, a pen flashlight, a legal-sized lined pad and several dandy pencils. So equipped, I seated myself for a preview showing of the new World Wide color motion picture "Two A Penny."

As the audience waited for the curtain to roll back I thought, "Others are here for a blessing, or for entertainment, or maybe for both. I am here to work. No trances!" Then the curtain rolled back.

Two hours later I emerged from my trance and looked at the electronic debris in my lap. Nothing written, nothing recorded. I put it back together and made my way to the exit, my mind somewhat in

the tangled state of Charlie Brown's kite.

Gradually the emotional recoil of "Two A Penny" diminished, and I was able to form some questions: What was the film all about? What was the major premise?

In a subtle and penetrating way, I decided, the story was about Jesus Christ. He was the motivator; he was the catalyst; he was the hero. Cliff Richard, the British pop singer, played a part. So did Dora Bryan, Avril Angers and Ang Holloway. Billy Graham also played a key part; but the leading role was taken by a man who never appeared.

Christ was the adversary against whom young Jamie Hopkins battled for nine reels. Christ was the Hound of Heaven who stalked his young quarry through London's pubs and alleys and clip joints and Eastland Court until finally he cornered him in a bombed-out church.

Christ walked silently into the gentle heart of a young shopgirl. He raised in her an Arabian thirst, then fed her from his springs until her life became a watered garden. Christ walked hand in hand with her through the weeds & brambles of a wicked metrop-

olis. And when the evangelist from America stood at the sacred desk in the great arena of Eastland Court and offered Life to all who would listen, it was the Man from Nazareth who spoke through him.

In the same way, when the despairing mother, Ruby Hopkins, took the hide off her no-account son, it was Christ who uttered the searing rebuke, "And when the little sparrows were hungry it was Christ, the Living Bread, who fed them."

The young teenager who comes to see this superb film will not know this. He will not be aware, so skillfully does James Collier build from Stella Linden's story line, that the Holy Spirit is brooding over the beaded screen, or that the Fisherman is drawing his net of love around a youthful heart. But when the final scene is shown and the curtain again rolls, there will be tantalizing questions in the mind.

What is this exciting thing that Carol found? Why is she so sure of herself and her discovery? It is available to anyone? Can I get in on it? What a thrilling prospect for what is probably the finest Christian film yet to be put into a can! The photographic artistry is superb; it was filmed on location, and it will raise professional eyebrows everywhere. The acting is genuine; how the mild-mannered Cliff Richard, whom I have met and heard several times, could turn himself into a London lout is itself cause for astonishment. Dora Bryan and Avril Angers and others in the cast are part of the spell; they are so human they hurt.

I can only speak from the standpoint of a "depression kid," but unless my guess is completely wrong, thousands of young men and women are going to find this film so absorbing that it will not leave them alone. It will follow them everywhere they go.

Guar Beans for This County? -- It's Possible

Some Eastland County farmers are looking for another cash crop that will produce income on land that is not planted in peanuts. Recent price increases for guar beans make them an attractive alternative crop for Eastland County. At the present time about 200,000 acres of guar beans are planted in this area. A few farmers in this area have been farming land besides peanuts and grain sorghum and forage crops. The net returns for both grain sorghum and forage are generally low. Any acceptable cash crop would generally be welcomed by most farmers.

There is no research data on guar bean production in this area. However, a great amount of information is available from the Rolling Plains area around Vernon. In that area yields have averaged about 800 pounds per acre with a spread from 400 to 1500 pounds per acre. Since the rainfall in Eastland County generally exceeds that of the Rolling Plains area, we should expect yields equally as good or better in this area.

The price for 1968 crop beans has been around \$4.60 per hundred pounds. A yield of 800 pounds of beans per acre would net approximately \$370.00 per acre after all production and harvesting costs including hauling. This much net per acre will probably double the average net return for grain sorghum on the same land. In years of good moisture the better land in Eastland County could easily exceed 800 pounds per acre. Yields of 1,000 to 1,500 pounds per acre can be expected some years.

Guar has been approved as a crop to be planted on grain sorghum diverted acres above the mandatory diversion level. In such cases the diversion payments is reduced by 50%, but the extra income from the guar beans can make the total significantly more than the diversion payments. If you plant guar on diverted acres for bean production, you must report this to the ASCS office.

If you are interested in planting some guar this year, please contact me. If there is sufficient interest, we could have a meeting to learn more about this alternative crop.

I was very happy to learn last week that Wendell Geslin's steer was named Grand Champion of the Houston Livestock Show. I'm sure you have heard his steer sold for a record \$31,000.

Wendell and his sister, Susan began their 4-H work and steer feeding projects when I was county agent of Hamilton County. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Geslin, are fine people and 4-H leaders. Another reason I was glad to hear this is because Bill McCutchen, former Eastland County Agent, County Agent, is Wendell's Supervisor. Still another thing I was happy to learn is that Wendell's Champion steer, an Angus, was purchased as a calf from Luther McClung of Rising Star.

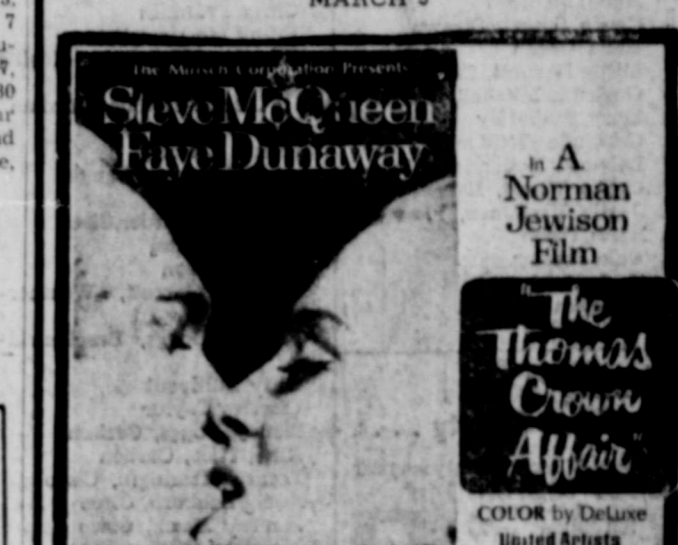

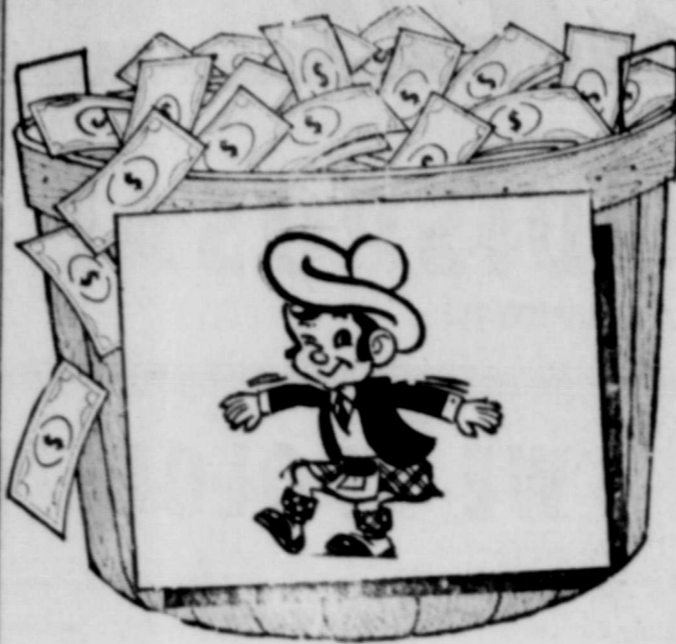

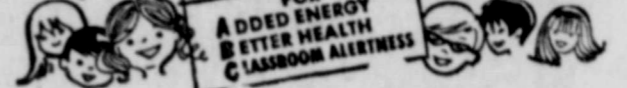
