BOMBSHELL USED
AT FORT MOULTRI

| Only Fifteen-Inch Shell Found After Fight in Which They Were First Used-J. W. Greer Found it Under Six Inches of Water-Weighs 336 Pounds <br> The first fifteen-inch bombshell ever seen by a Confederate soldier in the jewelery store of John H. Greer, at 511 Main street. It belongs to Mr. Greer's father, J. W. Greer of Aurora, terday, having been shipped here from South Carolina. <br> Mr. Greer is in the city visiting his son, and he told the story of the big shell yesterday to a reporter for The shell yesterday to a reporter Telegram. <br> It is fifteen inches in diameter, forty- ve inches in circumference and weighs 336 pounds. The hollow insid? is nine inches in diameter. <br> "The shell was fired from the federal gunboat Ironsides in the siege of Fort Moultrie, S. C., in April, 1863," said Mr. Greer. "I found it on the beach in fron onder about six inches of water and had not been exploded for its fuses had been put out. We found pieces of several other shells found pleces of several other shells far as I know this is the only one which has been preserved intact. <br> The fight at Fort Moultrie was the first in which anythos used, and the Ironsides fired these at us from guns, although it is generally supposed tha mortars were used for such big ammunition. <br> I was a member of company E of the Twentieth South Carolina infant ry, and fought in Moultrie during the siege. When I found the shell the commander of the fort, Colonel Butler ordered me to give it up, but my colo- nel said I should keep it if I wanted to, and I did. <br> "A short time after that some of the boys were going home and I sent the sherl with them.
