



The claim is made by the Virginians that no acceptance by congress is necessary and that all they need do is to put up the statue under the general law and need not ask anybody for authority. Congress has accepted by resolutions nearly all the statues that are in statuary hall. There are some there which have not yet been accepted, and may never be. Though I have not been taking any public action in this matter. I have personally talked with the Virginia delegation to dissuade them from this action. I felt free to do this, as I was born in that state myself.
