> Plan of Mr. Hill Is to Have Special Car Appropriately Decorated and Take Party to Northern States and Markets. Farm Land Is in Demand

Northern commission men. Iowa editors and people in general from the north who BEN E. CABELL. have visited Texas recently will have "Mayor of Dallas." their call returned some time during the coming summer, if the plans of L C Hill, horticultural agent for the Santa Fo re realized.

> The visitors to Texas from the north during the past few weeks have been especially loud in their praise of the outlook of the state and of the generally flattering conditions which they found here. It is heard on every hand. What Mr. Hill proposes to do if his plan meets with the approval of the general passenger agent of the Santa Fe, is to arrange for a special car for the transportation of a number of Texas farmers and real es tate men to points in the north, where they can display samples of Texas agricultural products to the best advantage.

This is a matter which Mr. Hill has had under consideration for some time He will leave tonight for Galveston where he will take up his plan with the proper Santa Fe officials, and if the suggestion meets with their approval the trip will be made.

Briefly, his plan is this: A Santa Fe car will be provided for proper decoration and transportation of a number of the largest owners of Texas land from va rious points in the state on the Santa Fe system. They will be given a very low rate for the round trip and accommo dation of a special car. They will also be permitted to convey samples of products of Texas farms. They will go to points in Kansas and perhaps othe northern states, where land has become of so great value as to render it impracticable for farming purposes. They will notify such county seat towns as the elect to visit of their coming and will arrange to spend from six hours to a day in each place. Here they will meet the farmers who care to investigate the prospects of Texas and learn of the actual conditions.
